DESCRIPTION: Common bond brick building with addition to right side. Left elevation has carved arches of three rows of headers over windows (radiating vousoirs). Rear elevation has a stepped parapet roof. Shadow of demolished rear addition is still visible. This building was originally connected with Thomas Fertilizer Company. It was demolished as part of a City of Gaithersburg project to provide more parking for the downtown merchants.
