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DESCRIPTION: The school is a large rectangular building with two frontspiece entrances, one at either end. Each double doorway has an elliptical fanlight above and one decorative electrical gothic style carriage lamp on each side of the doorway. Doors are probably original. Above doors is a dripstone. Bottom half of building is stucco over poured concrete; upper half is brick. A water table of stucco is located halfway up building.

All lower level windows have working three-paneled shutters which are locked shut whenever school is not in session. Upper level windows are 8-light casement. Shutters/windows on 1st and 2nd floor above doorways are set in Gothic sashes.

Both facade corners have tower effect with inlaid mosaic cross designs.
