DESCRIPTION: There is a full-width front porch which wraps to the left supported by eight plain square wooden posts. There is a narrow wood railing and decorative corner brackets. First and second bay have 2/2 d.h.s. windows with plain surrounds and louvered shutters. The entrance door in the right bay is half-glass with a very decorative lintel above and decorative surround. There is symmetrical fenestration on the second storey. The gable has one 2/2 d.h.s. window surrounded by decorative staggered butt shingles. Below the shingles at the base of the gable is an area of narrow vertical decorative boards.

Left elevation: At the rear of the wrap porch is a two-storey bay window area with hipped roof. There is a gable end directly above the hipped roof which is windowless. There is a small projection in front of the bay window which contains a side porch door with two long lights and raised panels below. Screen door has fancy millwork. The right elevation has symmetrical fenestration. The rear elevation has a two storey addition with raised seam shed roof. There are projecting verges and a plain frieze.
