pillars, plain square balusters with flat top railings. Long frieze on porch front, wooden cross trellis under porch. In the first left bay there is a side-by-side d.h.s.; second bay, a three-bay wide bay window with a side-by-side d.h.s. in the center bay; third bay, front door with plain surround. Main door is half-glass with wood panel below. There is also an 8-light wood screen door. The bay window has wood trim on all corner angles extending from ceiling to floor.

Left elevation: 6/1 d.h.s. in each bay. Right elevation: 6/1 side-by-side in each bay. Rear elevation: two first storey porch areas. The one on the left known as kitchen porch, right one as bedroom porch. They are divided by solid wood wall.

Dormers: one on each side, stick style, hipped with six-light windows and exposed beams. The roof has eaves projecting, rafters exposed. There is the original water pump on the kitchen porch and a meat house on the property with exposed rafters, tin roof with triple fishscale pattern shingles, a garage with corrugated tin roof and exposed rafters.

This house was lived in by the daughter of the original owner until 1984.
