DESCRIPTION: This is a one-storey church with a bell tower in the second left bay. There is a north-south gabled central block with an east-west gabled wing. There are three additions on the rear of the building. The building has been stuccoed, but the original woodframing remains visible at the top of the bell tower. Principal windows are stained glass with Gothic arches and plain molding. There is a cornerstone which reads "Epworth ME Church 1891". The entrance has two sets of two double doors with transoms of arched stained glass.
