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DESCRIPTION: There is a full-width front porch supported by short round columns on stretcher bond piers, plain square balusters with molded top and bottom railings. In the first and third bay there are three side-by-side d.h.s. 1/1 windows. The center one is twice as wide as the flanking ones. The middle bay contains the entrance door which appears to be original. It is half-glass with two raised vertical panels below and plain surrounds. The half-storey has small staggered butt wood shingles and a two-bay wide gable with one d.h.s. 1/1 in each. There is a bell-cast roof line. The roof is covered in a semi-circular patterned pressed tin. Several other houses on Maryland Avenue are roofed in this pattern.
