DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This frame house is two stories high and three bays wide; its intersecting gables result in a T-shaped plan. The building is clad in novelty siding with cornerboards. The principal (north) facade has the transomed entrance in the central bay, with a tall 2/2 sash window to its left, and smaller 2/2 windows aligned above these openings on the second floor. A two-story projecting wing occupies the right bay; a three-sided projecting bay rises the full height of the north-facing gable, with 1/1 sash windows on the first and second stories and square louvered openings at the attic level. A one-story porch with turned posts and scrollwork brackets spans the facade.

The west facade has two 2/2 windows on each floor, while the east gable is pierced by a single such window at both levels.

The roof is covered with patterned asphalt. Interior chimneys exit at the peak of the east gable and at the intersection of the ridges of the main roof and the west wing. The cornice is moulded and boxed, with returns on the east and north gables; it is bracketed across the north facade, but has a plain frieze on the west.

An early one-story shed-roofed addition extends to the south; a later structure, one story high and two bays square with a shallow gable roof, is connected to the house by a hyphen at the southwest corner.




