DESCRIPTION: A bungalow type building characterized by square wood shingles in the gable with frame front porch with plain frieze supported by three wood elephantine columns on brick piers. First bay on first level has three 6/1 windows with plain wood surrounds. Centered in gable in front is paired 6/1 windows with identical surrounds. A dormer and a three-bay wide area extends to the east of the main block of the building which is also decorated by square decorative shingles on the second level and covered by a shed roof. An exterior brick chimney extends from the northeast corner. This is a contributing bungalow-type building similar to others in the 20's block of Cedar. Application of aluminum siding has significantly changed the character of this building.
