The William Belt House is a two-story L-shaped frame farmhouse set upon a fieldstone foundation that is located on Howard Chapel Road near Unity. There is a large two-story ell on the rear (north) facade, now the kitchen, with a projecting fieldstone chimney. Outbuildings on the site include: a fieldstone spring house, a cinderblock and frame garage, a frame shed, and a dilapidated bank barn with a fieldstone foundation. Since the state acquired the property it had been rented to various tenants and fallen into disrepair. In 1996 it entered the Department of Natural Resources' curatorship program, with Lee and Mike Marsh undertaking the restoration of the house as well as the significant outbuildings.

9. Description: This five bay by one bay, two and a half story, L-shaped house faces south.

Built on fieldstone foundations, its exterior walls are covered by white asbestos shingles. The south (front) porch has a gabled roof supported by two square corner posts. The wooden paneled south door is flanked by three-light sidelights and surmounted by a six-light transom. On the east elevation there is an enclosed frame porch with a shed roof. Four large concentric semi-circular stone steps lead up to the porch. The east door is glass and wooden paneled.

There are three-(vertical lights)-over-one double-hung windows flanked by green wooden louvered shutters. The gable roof has gray asbestos shingles. There are two interior end chimneys at the east and west gable ends, and one exterior end chimney at the north gable end.

10. Significance:

This modest L-shaped, frame farmhouse in upper Montgomery County, built by a farmer 100 years ago, remains today very much as it was in the time of its builder. William T. Belt purchased 40 acres from Elisha Griffith in 1868, and shortly thereafter built his home.

William T.'s son, William H. Belt, lived in the house with his wife Johanna until his death in 1912. When his heirs sold the property at public auction, it was described as having a two story frame and log dwelling with five rooms, on a well-shaded lawn. There was a four room tenant house (no longer standing), a barn and other necessary outbuildings. The 120 acres of land included 80 acres cleared and in cultivation, the balance in hardwood timber, with a 4 or 5 acre orchard. The house, although now covered with shingles, is essentially the same today with one small addition next to the kitchen.

Members of the Howard family owned the farm until 1938, and after several intermediary owners the house and entire parcel plus some additional adjoining land was purchased in 1969 by the State of Maryland.

This five bay by one bay, two and a half story, L-shaped house faces south.

Built on fieldstone foundations, its exterior walls are covered by white asbestos shingles. The south (front) porch has a gabled roof supported by two square corner posts. The wooden paneled south door is flanked by three-light sidelights and surmounted by a six-light transom. On the east elevation there is an enclosed frame porch with a shed roof. Four large concentric semi-circular stone steps lead up to the porch. The east door is glass and wooden paneled.

There are three-(vertical lights)-over-one double-hung windows flanked by green wooden louvered shutters. The gable roof has gray asbestos shingles. There are two interior end chimneys at the east and west gable ends, and one exterior end chimney at the north gable end.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This modest L-shaped, frame farmhouse in upper Montgomery County, built by a farmer 100 years ago, remains today very much as it was in the time of its builder. William T. Belt purchased 40 acres from Elisha Griffith in 1868,¹ and shortly thereafter built his home. His son, William H. Belt, took over the property after William T's death in 1884, securing the rights of the other heirs to the property.

William H. Belt lived in the house with his wife, Johanna, until his death in 1912. As he left no children, his heirs, his brothers and sisters, sold the property at public auction.³ The property was described as having a two story frame and log dwelling with five rooms, on a well-shaded lawn. There was a four room tenant house (no longer standing), a barn and other necessary outbuildings. The 120 acres of land included 80 acres cleared and in cultivation, the balance in hardwood timber, with a 4 or 5 acre orchard.⁴ The house, although now covered with shingles, is essentially the same today with one small addition next to the kitchen.

The property was purchased at sale by Clifard L. Howard for \$4680. He in turn sold it to George S. Howard in 1917.⁵ After a 20 year residency, Howard sold the farm in 1938,⁶ and after several intermediary owners⁷ the house and entire parcel plus some additional adjoining land was purchased in 1969 by the State of Maryland, still very much in the same setting as it was when it was built.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The William Belt House located on the east side of Howard Chapel Road south of the Patuxent River is a two-story, five-bay structure dating from the latter quarter of the nineteenth century. A central doorway with sidelights and transom flanked by four double hung, sashed, shuttered windows defines the first story of the main (south) facade. Five 6/6 shuttered windows (the central window being smaller than the other) are symmetrically placed above the first story openings. Interior chimneys appear at both gable ends. A two-story ell projecting from the rear (north) facade has a large external stone chimney on its gable end. A shed roof one-story addition extends from the east facade of this ell.

It is quite possible that this section is of log construction. The small second-story windows positioned so close to the eaves and the immense external stone chimney are common features of log construction in this area.






