Section 7.1

The George L. Stabler house is a two-story, "L" shaped plan farmhouse on a fieldstone foundation. It has been undertaken by Leonard and Diana Mullar as a curatorship. Overall, in terms of condition and authenticity, the house has improved considerably since it entered the Department of Natural Resource's curatorship program. Asbestos siding was removed and the original clapboard was restored on the north and west facades. The outside of the house was repainted. A severely deteriorated shed addition on the south facade was removed, as was a shed roofed porch. On the north facade a new glassed in addition was added. A wooden garage with a poured concrete floor was built on the south side of the property. Other outbuildings on the site, such as wooden sheds and a wood stable, are used for storage and are in poor condition.

The George L. Stabler farmhouse is significant as an example of vernacular architecture typical of that constructed in Montgomery County from the mid-nineteenth through the early twentieth centuries. The house is believed to have been built by George L. Stabler about 1865.¹ George was given the land by his parents, Henry and Mary Stabler, in March of 1865. The farm bordered on the properties of Richard Iddings and Isaac Hartshorne and was located south of Hawlings River and north of the road to Thomas Lee's Mill.² Henry had purchased the land just two years prior, in two separate deeds, one from Hillery E. Harding and the other from Thomas Lee.³ George L. Stabler was a farmer and cattle breeder.⁴ He was possibly a miller as well. In the deed in which he sold his house, he reserved the water rights of the Patuxent River... "to repair the banks or back the water higher up so far as may be necessary for the proper workings of his mill."⁵ The tax assessment records report that additions were made to the house during George's ownership, between the years 1873 and 1875.⁶

In October of 1886, George and his wife, Annie, sold the house and property to Charles R. Hartshorne for \$2500.⁷ Charles sold it in June of 1898 to Edward Boswell.⁸ In December of 1899, Boswell sold the house to Edward C. Gilpin who kept it only two years and then sold it to Dr. William Tatum in January of 1902.⁹

In 1914, William's widow, Marian, defaulted on the mortgage to the Sandy Spring Savings Institution. The property was described in the advertisement of its sale as the farm on which Dr. William R. Tatum resided at the time of his death, located about 2 1/4 miles north of Ashton, near Haviland's Mill. The farm contained 93 acres of land, all in a "good state of cultivation" and almost completely cleared. It was improved by a two story frame dwelling of eight rooms, an ice house, meat house, a barn measuring 20x60 feet with a cow stable below, a stable for eight horses and other outbuildings. In addition, there was a "never failing" well of "excellent" water at the door. The farm was purchased by Charles Adelbert Oursler for \$1000.¹⁰

Charles and his wife, Mary Agnes, owned the farm for many years, finally selling it in June of 1966 to Forrest Marrs, of Marrs candy bars.¹¹ Forrest owned

owned the farm until December of 1975 when he gave it to the present owners, the Department of Natural Resources.¹²

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The George Stabler House located on the north side of Haviland Mill Road in Patuxent State Park is a curious two-story, asbestos shingled over frame "L" farmhouse built in several sections.

The main section is two bays wide and two bays deep, its principal facade facing eastward. The main entrance is located in the northern bay. Two windows, a 6/6 sashed to the immediate south and a smaller 6-light, fixed sashed window to the immediate north flank the doorway. A third window with 6/6 sash occupies the southernmost bay. A standing seam tin shed-roofed porch with turned supports shelters the main entrance. Two 6/6 sashed windows are found in the openings of the second story. All windows yield a simple timber surround and projecting wooden sills. Interior brick chimneys are located at both gable ends of the standing seam tin roof.

A lower, two-story, gable-roofed addition extends to the north. A central vertical boarded door surmounted by a six-light, fixed sashed window defines the east facade.

A one-story, gable-roofed shed extends to the north of this addition. This wing, unlike the other sections retains its original clapboard.

A two-story "L" projects to the west near the southern end of the main block. It measures two bays wide and two bays deep.

On the south facade of this wing a false gable has been added to give the appearance of two end gable houses adjacently built. This facade now measures five bays. A central entrance flanked by two 6/6 sash windows define the five openings of the first story. Windows with 6/6 sash mark the four corresponding openings of the second story. A pair of 6/6 sash windows are found at the attic level of the older section; a single 6/6 sash window is centrally positioned at the attic level of the "L" section.

The west facade of this wing is distinguished by two 6/6 sash wings on the first story surmounted by two smaller 6/6 sash wings on the second story. A pair of 6/6 sashed wings are found at the attic level. Again, all windows possess simple timber surrounds with projecting wooden sills.

An enclosed shed-roof addition extends across the rear (north) facade of the "L". An entrance is centrally located.

A stone gable-roofed smokehouse is located west of the main dwelling.

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STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The 1865 Martenet and Bond Map of Montgomery County and the 1879 Hopkins Atlas of Montgomery County indicates that George Stabler was the owner of a farm in this general vicinity. Land records research in the Montgomery County Courthouse confirms this fact. George Stabler received a parcel of land from Henry Stabler (their relationship is unclear) in 1865.

Henry Stabler, according to Farquhar, Old Homes and History of Montgomery County, Maryland, arrived in Montgomery County in the early 1840s and received from his mother-in-law, Elizabeth Ellicott Lea, a tract of land situated on the east side of what is now New Hampshire Avenue. There, he built his rambling two-story frame house known as Roslyn and remained there with his wife Mary Lea until his death in 1890.

Although a more modest farm dwelling compared to nearby Roslyn, the George Stabler house is a good example of nineteenth century agrarian dwellings.

Recommendations

The Stabler dwelling and outbuildings have greatly suffered from Department of Natural Resources neglect. It is the recommendation of this report that the farm be returned to private ownership in an effort to halt further deterioration.





The following sites were found by the Preservation Commission to be too greatly altered from the period of their architectural or historical significance or not to meet Ordinance criteria for designation.






