9. Description The main section of this frame house is L-shaped, 2½ stories, three bays by two bays. It faces west, and is removed a considerable distance from the road. The house is built on fieldstone foundations, and the main section is covered with brown-stained shingles. There is a cross gable roof with grey asbestos shingles; there are white butt shingles in the west cross gable. There are 6-over-6 double-hung windows on the east ell and 2-over-2 double-hung windows on the west section. On the north side of the house is a one-story, 1 bay by 1 bay, flat-roofed addition. The extreme east section is a 3 bay by 1 bay stucco-over-cinderblock addition with a three-stepped south facade. There are 2 chimneys.
10. Significance: The land on which this house stands was once part of "Mitchell's Range". As it was bought and sold over the years, it also carried the names of "Treble Trouble" and "Baker's Chance". By 1856 Samuel Higgins and his wife, Eliza, owned 115 acres nearby, and others in the Higgins family bought parts of Baker's Chance. In 1897 Sam and Eliza lost their nearby property by defaulting on a mortgage, and their son, George, took them in to live with him and his family. Needing room to accommodate three generations of Higginses, George built the present house about 1904. (Thereafter, George's old house was only used to store grain and by the 1930's was torn down.) The property was sold in 1921. A later owner added the adjoining property "Treble Trouble". Approximately 100 acres along Great Seneca Creek has been sold to the State as part of Great Seneca State Park.

**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

The main section of this frame house is L-shaped, 2½ stories, three bays by two bays. It faces west, and is removed a considerable distance from the road.

The house is built on fieldstone foundations, and the main section is covered with brown-stained shingles. Two fieldstone steps lead to the glass-and-wooden-paneled west door. There is a cross gable roof with grey asbestos shingles; there are white butt shingles in the west cross gable. The cornice line is boxed and returned. There are six-over-six double-hung windows on the east ell and two-over-two double-hung windows on the west section. West windows are flanked by white wooden paneled shutters. There is a bay window on the north elevation.

On the northwest corner, there is an exterior stone and brick chimney, large at the base and tapering as it reaches the height of the central gable. There is an interior chimney at the south end of the house.

On the north side of the house is a one-story, one bay by one bay, flat-roofed addition. The extreme east section is a three bay by one bay stucco-over-cinderblock addition with a three-stepped south facade. There is an L-shaped one-story lean-to on the east and south elevations.

The house is set in a beautifully landscaped area of maples, birches, boxwoods, and cedars.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This house is known as "the Higgins Place". The land was once part of "Mitchell's Range" and was bought and sold in various bits and pieces since c. 1800, also carrying names of "Treble Trouble" and "Baker's Chance".

By 1856, Samuel Higgins and his wife, Eliza, owned 115 acres nearby. In 1872, others in the Higgins family bought two small pieces of land near Seneca Creek of 15 1/8 acres and 16 1/2 acres,<sup>1</sup> and in 1886, Sam's son, George, added to it by buying 108 acres.<sup>2</sup> This total of 139 acres was all part of "Baker's Chance".

When Sam and Eliza Higgins lost their nearby property in 1897 due to defaulting on a mortgage, son George took them in to live with him and his family. With a small house and this addition to the family, they needed more room. Accordingly, George built the present house about 1904, large enough to accommodate three generations of Higginses. Thereafter, George's old house was no longer occupied and was used to store grain. What remained by the 1930s was torn down.

The Higgins family lived there until 1921 when the property was sold to William Warfield.<sup>3</sup> In 1930, at which time Karl Fenning was the owner, the adjoining property of 204 acres, known as "Treble Trouble", was added.<sup>4</sup> This property had previously belonged to the Hoskinson family. In 1940 the total of approx. 340 acres was bought by Paul Culbertson, whose widow is the present owner. Approximately 100 acres along Great Seneca Creek has been sold to the state of Maryland for use as part of Great Seneca Creek State Park.

SUBJECT: Amendment to the Approved and Adopted Master Plan for Historic Preservation in Montgomery County, Maryland

WHEREAS, in September, 1983, the Montgomery County Planning Board transmitted to the Montgomery County Council the Final Draft Amendment to the Historic Preservation Master Plan, proposing the addition of several historic sites for inclusion in the Master Plan and the removal of several sites from the Locational Atlas and Index of Historic Sites in Montgomery County, Maryland; and

WHEREAS, on December 13, 1983, the Montgomery County Council held a public hearing wherein oral and written testimony was received concerning the Final Draft Amendment to the Historic Preservation Master Plan; and

WHEREAS, on May 22, 1984, the Council Planning, Housing and Economic Development Committee reviewed the Final Draft Amendment to the Historic Preservation Master Plan and the issues raised at the public hearing with the Montgomery County Planning Board, staff and affected parties; and

WHEREAS, the Montgomery County Council reviewed the recommendations of the Planning, Housing and Economic Development Committee at a worksession held on June 11, 1984.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council, sitting as a District Council for that portion of the Maryland-Washington Regional District within Montgomery County, that -

The Historic Preservation Master Plan is hereby amended by the inclusion of the following sites and/or resources:


APPENDIX
