**Description:**

The Richard Leizear (Leishear) House, constructed circa 1865, was previously surveyed by the Montgomery County Historic Preservation Commission in January 1983. According to prior survey forms, the 1865 house was damaged by fire and rebuilt in 1935. The building was renovated again in 1994, reorienting the principle facade from the road on the north to the driveway on the east. The house has been modernized and resembles a modern tract house. The barn mentioned in the previous survey is extant.

**National Register Evaluation:**


The Richard Leizear (Leishear) House, constructed circa 1865, was previously surveyed by the Montgomery County Historical Commission. Information from the prior survey forms indicate that the house and barn were constructed circa 1865, and that the house was damaged by fire and rebuilt in 1935. The house was remodeled in 1994, changing the orientation of the building from the road on the north to the driveway on the east. The property is not eligible under Criterion A, as research conducted indicates no association with any historic events or trends significant in the development of national, state or local history. Historic research indicates that the property has no association with persons who have made specific contributions to history, and therefore, it does not meet Criterion B. It is not eligible under Criterion C, due to a loss of architectural and material integrity as a result of the most recent alteration. The architectural character and historical association has been lost, as the house is now indistinguishable from a modern suburban tract house. The barn on the property is an example of a common agricultural building type. It has lost its agricultural association through the demolition of all other related structures, and its architectural integrity has been severely compromised by deterioration. Finally the property has no known potential to yield important information, and therefore, does not meet Criterion D.

The Richard Leizear House is a greatly altered ca. 1868 frame structure heavily damaged by fire and rebuilt in 1935 as a simple Colonial Revival house. After 1965 the house was completely sided with aluminum and had a one-story extension added to the rear. In 1994 another extensive renovation of the building was completed adding a major two-story extension and one-story garage to the rear. This recent construction also reoriented the house's principle facade from the road on the north to a driveway on the east. The architectural character of the building has been radically modernized into a Neoclectic suburban tract house.

Behind the house there is an extant outbuilding that is a late nineteenth/early twentieth century general purpose barn. The structure, now deteriorated and overgrown with vegetation, is an English Barn type that was altered at a later date with the addition of a shed enclosure on the north facade. The main granary section of the clapboard sided gable-ended structure and its stable sheds (on the east and west) has a standing seam metal roof while the shed on the north has composition shingles.

Prepare both a summary paragraph of significance and a general statement of history and support.

Summary: The Richard Leizear House once had significance as a representative example of a period and type of late nineteenth century vernacular architecture. However, the building has been so extensively rebuilt and modified that it no longer conveys any associations with the agricultural history of the county or the defining characteristics of any period or type of historic vernacular architecture.

Built around 1868 and reconstructed after a fire in 1935, the building was until recently a modest two-story Colonial Revival style house, three bays in width, with an orderly symmetrical facade and side hall entrance.<sup>1</sup> Located near the crossroads of Briggs-Chaney and Good Hope Road between Colesville and Spencerville, the farmstead was one of many small owner-operated agricultural properties that evolved from subsistence farming to trucking produce, poultry and dairy products to the nearby urban market of Washington, D. C. between 1870 and 1930.<sup>2</sup> Only a deteriorated barn, which is a common type in the county, recalls any associations with the agricultural history of Montgomery County.

Endnotes

1 The date of construction has been estimated from map and land record research conducted by Catherine Crawford for the "Richard Leizear House," MHT Form (1/83). The property was purchased in 1868 and no structure appeared on Martinet and Bond's "Map of Montgomery County" (1865). A building does appear on the site on G. M. Hopkins's "Atlas of Fifteen Miles Around Washington" (1879). Kathleen Anderson, the owner of the property from 1956-1990, provided evidence that the house had burned in 1935. This information was confirmed by M-NCPPC preservation staff in a site inspection in 1991.

The Richard Leizear house is significant as an example of rural vernacular architecture typical of that constructed in Montgomery County from the mid-nineteenth through the early twentieth centuries. The house was probably built by Richard Leizear sometime between 1868 and 1872.<sup>1</sup> Richard built his house on 67 3/8 acres of a tract of land referred to as "Beall's Manor," etc. which he purchased in January of 1868 from James and Francis Shreve for \$1,400.<sup>2</sup> In February of 1875, Richard conveyed the property to his wife, Martha. They lived in the house with their two children, Mary and Elias. In 1902, Martha died (predeceased by her husband) and the house went to her children.<sup>3</sup> Mary conveyed her share of the house to her brother in 1903. Then when Elias died in 1924, he willed the property to Mary.<sup>4</sup>

Mary died in 1930 and the house was then sold to William E. O'Keefe for \$6,600.<sup>5</sup> William sold the house in June of 1932 and it then passed through a succession of owners. It was purchased in January of 1956 by James and Kathleen Anderson.<sup>6</sup> James, born in nearby Colesville, was a Montgomery County police officer and later, owner of J.M. Anderson Landscaping Company. He died in August of 1976 leaving his wife, Kathleen, and three daughters, Lola, Kaye and Sandra, and eight grandchildren.<sup>7</sup> The house is presently owned by Kathleen Anderson.

This is an average, late-nineteenth century farmhouse with a three-bay main (north) facade, and a doorway in the NW bay. It was probably built sometime between 1865 and 1878.
