Prepare both a summary paragraph of significance and a general statement of history and support.

The Adam Noll house is significant as an example of both the chink & log architecture of the early 1800's and the later frame farm dwellings of the mid to late 1800's. The present owner, Mrs. Anita Empleton, states that she has heard from various sources that the early log section of the house was built during the end of the 1700's.¹ If this is true, the house was probably built by Bernard Gilpin, who owned a large tract of land which included the lot on which the house sits. In January of 1842, Gilpin sold the house, sitting on 5 acres and 31 perches of a tract of land referred to as "Addition to Charley's Forest," to Charles Hill for \$181.78.² Two years later, Gilpin sold Hill additional acreage bringing the total of Hill's land holdings up to 11 acres and 96 square perches.³ In October of 1848, Charles Hill sold the property to Edward Hill for \$650.⁴ Edward later sold the property to Adam Noll, Sr. for \$1125 in September of 1863. It was probably Adam Noll who added the second (or middle) addition to the house which the present owner estimates, based on what she has been told, to be approximately 120 years old.⁵

Adam Noll died intestate, leaving as his heirs Adam Noll, Jr., Susan Boswell, Mary Thompson and Catherine Kemp, to whom the property passed. In October of 1887, the heirs of Adam Noll sold the house to Eva Stiffler, also a relative.⁶ When Eva died, the house went to her heirs, Susan Boswell, Mary Thompson, Catherine Kemp, John F. Noll, Hart & Ella Noll and Mary & Charles Gannon. They sold it in July of 1911 to Maurice J. Stabler for \$1105.⁷ In September of 1946, Maurice and his wife, Cynthia, sold the house to Benjamin and Virginia Richmond who sold it in June of 1951 to Ray and Myrtle Olson.⁸ The Olsons added the third section to the house in 1953.⁹ In August of 1963, Myrtle (by then a widow) sold the house to the present owners, Bernard E. and Anita Empleton.¹⁰ Anita Empleton states that the house has been left generally unaltered and, in her opinion, the integrity of the old style farm architecture has been maintained.


