9. Description: This two story, square, gray shingle house is completely isolated on its nine acres off of Capitol View Avenue. It has a flat tin roof with central chimney and square copola, and a full basement which is at ground level in the rear. The front, or east, side has a four bay porch which is presently one story but originally was two stories. There is a second floor door on the right or north leading to a deck on the roof of the present porch.

The four bay south facade has a slightly protruding three facet two story two bay projection towards the rear or west. The rear of the house is three full stories with five bays across the cement foundation wall.

The four bay north side of the house includes the rectangular projection with shed roof towards the rear. Also on this face is an adjoining shallow two bay rectangular projection in the center which delineates the interior hall landing. The windows are two-over-two sash type throughout the house. A small frame "honey house" has been used as a home.

10. Significance: This house was built by Alexander and Annie Proctor, secondary developers of Capitol View Park. Capitol View Park was subdivided as a new community along the Metropolitan Branch of the B&O Railroad in 1887 by Mary Harr. Some lots sold, and five years later she transferred the remaining property to Alexander M. Proctor.

Proctor spent his summers in Capitol View Park, and designed homes in Forest Glen and Kensington; he later became an architect. He conveyed the property to his wife Annie, who sold a number of lots to Mary F. and Margaret L. Sewall in 1907. A house was on the property at the time of the sale. The Sewall sisters, and another sister, Hannah, lived there until 1927, selling it to Philip G. Wright, President of Brookings Institute, and his wife Elixabeth Q.S. Wright. The Wrights had three sons who entered careers of political science, genetics, and civil aeronautics. In 1937, Elizabeth, then a widow, sold the property to Charles and Leona Milton, the present owners. Dr. Milton is a geologist, and Mrs. Milton is an artist.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This two story, square, gray shingle house is completely isolated on its nine acres off of Capitol View Avenue. It has a flat tin roof with central chimney and square cupola, and a full basement which is at ground level in the rear. The front, or east, side has a four bay porch which is presently one story but originally was two stories. There is a second floor door on the right or north leading to a deck on the roof of the present porch.

The four bay south facade has a slightly protruding three facet two story two bay projection towards the rear or west. The rear of the house is three full stories with five bays across the cement foundation wall. Included are a door to the basement and a door at the far left or north to the ground floor storage area of the small two story wing on the north side of the house.

The four bay north side of the house includes the rectangular projection with shed roof towards the rear. Also on this face is an adjoining shallow two bay rectangular projection in the center which delineates the interior hall landing. The windows here as generally throughout the house are two-over-two sash type.

The interior, with one working fireplace in the living room, is a side hall plan with four rooms on each floor including the basement. The two rear basement rooms are finished and were used as the kitchen and dining room before the present owners moved those two rooms to the first floor shortly after they moved in, in 1937.

There is a small frame house on the property, which was used from c. 1900-1938 for processing "Beechbank Honey". It has been made into a dwelling and is rented out.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This house is important as the home of Alexander and Annie Proctor, secondary developers of Capitol View Park, subdivided as a new community along the Metropolitan Branch of the B&O Railroad.

Mary Harr purchased 123½ acres of farmland along the railroad right-of-way and subdivided it in 1887.¹ Five years later, some lots had been sold and houses built, and she had transferred the majority of the remaining property in Capitol View Park to Alexander M. Proctor.² Proctor spent his summers in Capitol View Park, and designed homes in Forest Glen and Kensington; he later became an architect.³ After the property was conveyed to Proctor's wife Annie, she continued to sell lots in the subdivision. Annie Proctor held onto the majority of lots in Block 34 for another ten years.

In 1907, Annie Proctor sold to Mary F. and Margaret L. Sewall of Washington, D.C., 11 complete lots and parts of five others on Block 34 for \$4,000; at that time a building was on the property.⁴ It is believed that the house was constructed not long before the transfer.⁵

The Sewall sisters, and another sister, Hannah, lived in Capitol View Park for a number of years, selling the property in 1927 after the death of Margaret, the marriage of Hannah, and the relocation of Mary. The new owners were Philip G., President of Brookings Institute, and his wife Elizabeth Q.S. Wright.⁶ The Wrights also purchased a small piece of additional land from the estate of Alexander Proctor.

There were three Wright sons (Quincy the political scientist, Sewall the geneticist, and Theodore the civil aeronautics administrator and administrator at Cornell University).

In 1937 Elizabeth Wright, widow, sold the property to Charles and Leona Milton, the present owners. Dr. Milton is a geologist, and Mrs. Milton is an artist.


