9. Description: This two-and-a-half story frame dwelling sits well back from Stoneybrook Avenue on a shaded .84 acre lot. The house, which faces west, has tan novelty siding and a gabled roof which is two stories high in the rear but swoops down to the one story enclosed porch in the front. The roof line is broken in the front by a four bay shed roofed dormer. The two bay porch, which extends across the entire front of the house, includes triple windows on the left or north and double doors on the right.

The north facade has an unusual two story one bay half-round projection toward the front. There is a small rectangular projection with porch, a later addition to the kitchen, from the rear of this side also. The four bay south facade contains a three bay faceted projection near the front (west) and a covered porch toward the rear which contains the present main entrance door.

10. Significance: This striking example of early 1900s architecture is one of a number of dwellings built at that time in Capitol View Park. This community developed along the B & O Railroad between Kensington and Forest Glen after it was platted for subdivision in 1887 by Mary Harr. This dwelling appears from a Mechanic's Lien to have been built in 1900 by Alexander Proctor. The plasterer, Benjamin Franklin Crown, described it as cottage #1, a two story frame, shingle roof house with pediment front and basement, two bay windows and front porch, having 28' frontage and 40' depth.

The house was sold to Rachel Fay in 1906, under whose name the first tax assessment appears in 1907. The improvement assessment jumped in 1910, indicating an addition to the house. The property changed hands several times, being owned by the Tuckers (1913), Ayers (1918), Vipond (1920), Hambrook (1928), Young (1941), and Price (1955) families, and was purchased by its present owner in 1963.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This two-and-a-half story frame dwelling sits well back from Stoneybrook Avenue on a shaded .84 acre lot. The house, which faces west, has tan novelty siding and a gabled roof which is two stories high in the rear but swoops down to the one story enclosed porch in the front. The roof line is broken in the front by a four bay shed roofed dormer. The two bay porch, which extends across the entire front of the house, includes triple windows on the left or north and double doors on the right.

The north facade has an unusual two story one bay half-round projection toward the front. There is a small rectangular projection with porch, a later addition to the kitchen, from the rear of this side also. The four bay south facade contains a three bay faceted projection near the front (west) and a covered porch toward the rear which contains the present main entrance door.

Other than a small addition off the side of the kitchen, the only apparent alteration in the house was the enclosing of the front porch, the right hand section of which was made into a study nook off the living room. The dramatic shed roof is two stories high in the rear, but swoops down to the one story porch in the front, broken by a double dormer.

Earlier, when the front porch was open, the main entrance was on the front, according to longtime neighbor, Mrs. Helen Pratt Secrest. The main entrance of the house is now located on the right or south side toward the rear. The entrance room is large and contains the stairs to the second floor. Straight ahead, also in the rear of the house, is the kitchen with the small addition. The front of the house contains two lovely large rooms with 9½ foot ceilings and each with a side bay window. The room to the left of the entrance hall is the living room with its nook added from the porch. The room next to it and in front of the kitchen is the dining room with its fireplace on a center interior wall. The doorways are large and framed with bullseye molding, as are the windows. On the second floor are two large front bedrooms, two smaller ones to the rear, and a bath. The third floor contains a large dormitory type bedroom.

SPECIFIC DATES 1900 BUILDER/ARCHITECT Alexander Proctor

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This striking example of early 1900's architecture is one of a number of dwellings built at that time in Capitol View Park. This community developed along the B&O Railroad between Kensington and Forest Glen after it was platted for subdivision in 1887 by Mary Harr.¹ This dwelling appears from a Mechanic's Lien to have been built in 1900 by Alexander Proctor. The plasterer, Benjamin Franklin Crown, described it as cottage #1, a two story frame, shingle roof house with pediment front and basement, two bay windows and front porch, having 28' frontage and 40' depth. (Cottage #2 is also described and except for the bay windows appears to have been quite similar. This was the neighboring Shinn house which was demolished in 1979.)²

The house and 0.84 acre were sold to Rachel Fay in 1906,³ under whose name the first tax assessment appears in 1907.⁴ The improvement assessment jumped in 1910,⁵ indicating an addition to the house. The property changed hands several times, being owned by the Tucker (1913), Ayers (1918), Vipond (1920), Hambrook (1928), Young (1941), and Price (1955) families, and was purchased by its present owner in 1963.⁶


