The McCeney farmhouse is significant as an example of rural vernacular architecture typical of that constructed in Montgomery County from the mid-nineteenth through the early twentieth centuries. The house is believed to have been built about 1858 by Henry McCeney. It was built on approximately 370 acres which McCeney purchased in April of 1858 from the Gaither family.<sup>2</sup> Henry ran a large farm here with his wife, Annie, and their children. When Henry died in March of 1864, the farm became the property of his widow who continued to run it.<sup>3</sup>

The farm remained in the McCeney family for many years. William H. McCeney, the son of Henry and Annie, lived here and ran a dairy farm. William also served in the Maryland General Assembly and on the Montgomery County School Board.<sup>4</sup> In 1938, William sold the farmhouse on about 54 acres to the R.E. Latimer Land Co. (who developed the property that now surrounds the old farmhouse).<sup>5</sup> Then in May of 1947, the R.E. Latimer Land Co. sold the house to Nathan and Corinne Poole who sold it a few months later to Paul and Myra Betters.<sup>6</sup> Then in July of 1980, Myra Betters sold the house to the present owner, Philip R. Spray.<sup>7</sup>
