9. Description: This three bay by four bay, two-and-a-half story rectangular house sits on a low rise facing south. The first level is clapboarded; the second level is shingled and is separated by a belt course. The house is painted pink and has maroon trim. The south porch is enclosed and has a half hipped roof supported by four voluted columns. A projecting gable roof supported by two square wooden posts extends out over the five poured concrete steps which lead up to the porch. There are one-over-one double-hung windows and some multi-diamond paned sashes above a single light sash. There is a two story bay window on the south elevation. There is a single hipped dormer window on the east and west elevations. The house has a gable roof covered by asbestos shingles.

10. Significance: This house is representative of the dwellings built in the suburbs at the turn of the twentieth century.

The community of Somerset Heights was begun by five employees of the U.S. Department of Agriculture in 1890. They subdivided a tract of 50 acres, named streets for English counties, and agreed to construct five residences immediately. In 1897 Joshua B. Callahan bought 72,625 sq. ft. on Block 1 for \$100, and constructed a house on the northeast corner of lot 20. He sold the property to Dr. Charles A. Crampton, one of the five founders of Somerset Heights, and its first mayor. Crampton did not live in this house as he had his own comfortable dwelling at 4805 Dorset Avenue. Crampton sold the house immediately upon purchasing it, but it returned to the Crampton family in 1912 and remained there until 1923 when Lillie Crampton sold the property to Carl Markam. Markam lived there ten years. Then it was purchased by William and Harriet Garnett, who lived there until 1944. It passed through four more owners before being purchased by the present owners in 1976.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This three bay by four bay, two and a half story rectangular house sits on a low rise facing south.

Built on fieldstone foundations, the first level has pink clapboarded walls. A belt course separates the first level from the pink shingled upper levels. The south porch is enclosed and has a half hipped roof supported by four voluted columns. A projecting gable roof supported by two square wooden posts extends out over the five poured concrete steps which lead up to the porch. The south door is vertical paneled oak with a nine light inset window. The north door is a glass and wooden paneled door set into a two story enclosed porch.

Generally, there are one-over-one double-hung windows. There are some multi-diamond paned sashes above single light sashes. There is a two story bay window on the south elevation. In the south gable end there is a three part window: the center window is wider than the two flanking windows and all have multi-diamond paned sashes above a single light sash. At the peak of the north and south gable ends there are small round-headed windows. There is a single hipped dormer window on the east and west elevation.

The house has a gable roof covered by asbestos shingles with wide boxed eaves. There is an interior chimney on the east elevation.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE
 This house is representative of the dwellings built in the suburbs at the turn of the 20th century.

The community of Somerset Heights was begun by five employees of the U.S. Department of Agriculture in 1890. In that year Harvey Wiley, Charles Crampton, Daniel Salmon, Miles Fuller and Horace Horton organized the Somerset Heights Colony Company and purchased 50 acres of "Friendship" just over the District line in Montgomery County. They subdivided the tract, named streets for English counties, and agreed to construct five residences immediately. Lot sales at first were brisk, but by the end of the decade interest in the project had waned.

Block 1, on which this property lies, is a long narrow strip with 20 lots fronting onto Cumberland Avenue. In 1897 Joshua B. Callahan bought 72,625 square feet on this block for \$100, agreeing not to "erect any house which shall cost less than \$1000, and not to erect on the rear of said property any structure to cost less than \$100...and it shall not be used for manufacturing or mechanical purposes nor shall spirituous liquors be sold thereon." By the time Callahan resold the northeast corner of lot 20 in Block 1 nine years later to Charles A. Crampton, he had constructed a house on the property.

Crampton did not live in this house, as he had his own comfortable home at 4805 Dorset Avenue, the first to be occupied in the new development. Dr. Crampton was assistant chief of the Bureau of Chemistry, Department of Agriculture, owner of the first automobile in Somerset, father of the first child to be born there, and the town's first elected mayor in 1906.

Crampton sold the house immediately upon purchasing it, but it returned to the Crampton family in 1912 and remained there until 1923. In that year Lillie Crampton sold the property to Carl Markam, who lived there until 1933 when it was purchased by William and Harriet Garnett. The Garnetts owned it for many years. It passed through several more owners before being purchased by the present owners in 1976.


