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A Queen Anne/Victorian style residence, this house was built c. 1910-1912 on land purchased by Ira H. Jones in 1910. It is a very late example of a style that was popular in the late 1800s. The property, consisting of 18, 844 square feet, described as lots 5 and 6 in Dille's addition to Linden, was conveyed to Jones by the Lawrence family, who also owned an adjacent farm.¹ Today the house sits on a single lot of 9,032 square feet (former Lot 5, now Lot 34, Block 3, Dille's addition to Linden).

The two-story frame dwelling has a gable roof with a center chimney and sits on a concrete foundation. The main block has a two-story extended bay window and a full-width front porch that wraps around the south elevation. The porch features turned posts and lattice-work with a classical pediment over the entry. Original windows are 1/1 sash. To the rear is a two-story ell wing with enclosed porches on both levels, built before 1931.²

The architectural integrity of the house has been compromised with alterations, including the addition of vinyl siding and a shed roof dormer on the south elevation. A basement garage probably dates from the 1930s.

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A plat and surveyor's field notes recorded in 1873 describe the division of a 32-acre piece of land, part of a tract known as Joseph's Park, into a subdivision "to be denominated 'Linden.'" Lots 5 and 6, located at the corner of Warren Street between Dille Street (now Linden Lane) and Montgomery Street, are delineated on the plat.³

Initially acquired by Annie E. and Center Lawrence, Lots 5 and 6 were conveyed by the Lawrences to their daughter Annie J. Lawrence in 1895. The two lots, consisting of 18,844 square feet, were sold to Ira Jones in March, 1910. Between 1910 and 1912 Jones built a house on the property; he subsequently defaulted on the mortgage and the house was advertised for sale in June, 1912. The notice of sale describes the property as "improved by a commodious new nine room dwelling with water, electric lights, bath, ample shade &c. . . . a very desirable suburban home." It was further noted that the property was "within three minutes walk of the steam cars, and about 5 minutes walk of the Forest Glen & Washington Electric Cars."⁴

After a series of owners, the house was occupied by James and Frances Benedict from 1918 to 1969. The property changed hands in 1970 when it was purchased by Boren and Lynn Chertkov. In 1992 the property was subdivided and a new house was constructed on Lot 6. The present owner of former Lot 5, Barbara S. Logan, purchased the house on its single lot of 9,032 square feet in 1993.⁵






#36/2 - LINDEN HISTORIC DISTRICT


#36/2 - LINDEN HISTORIC DISTRICT

Vicinity Map for Ira Jones House (36/2-8)




