

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (If known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Mary's Mount is located four miles south of the intersection of Route Maryland 2 and Route Maryland 214; 0.8 miles south of the intersection of Route Maryland 2 and Mill Swamp Road; one-half mile east of Route Maryland 2, south of the Mill Swamp Road.

The original one-and-a-half-story, gambrel roof house of c. 1742 has retained its gambrel concept and original height and underslopes in the interior. A false front has raised the building to two full stories on the exterior only, with peaked dormers in the roof which latter runs N/S. The three-bay telescopic effect has its second and third sections to the north, each preceding section being lower than its neighbor to the south.

Engaged to the south gable is a pair of exterior chimneys and a chimney pent. Two smooth haunches are to the east and west and a narrow haunch cuts, to the north, into the roof line. The placement of the stacks is not of equal distance from the ridgepole. The brick chimney pent has one small window to the east, the gable end window is set between the chimneys at the attic level. Both gable ends are brick, of English bond, two bays wide. The facade walls of each section are clapboard. The east end of the south section has a single interior chimney.

The main house is a simple four-room plan. The north end is the stair hall with an original stairway, closed stringers, original handrail and spindles of solid walnut. Most of the trim, except for the stair and doors, was replaced early in the nineteenth century, but is still in good style for that period. Doors and chair rail in the front parlor are bolection molding.

The middle section is slightly lower than the main house. This originally had two rooms. It has a fireplace with a nineteenth-century mantel, contemporary with other trim of that period in the house. The smallest, northernmost section is a 20' by 15' kitchen.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE (Include Personages, Dates, Events, Etc.)

The tract called Mary's Mount was patented by Thomas Miles, and was granted at the time of the restoration of the government of Maryland to Lord Baltimore's officials, about 1660. Although patented by Miles, the property was later acquired by the Larkin family of nearby Larkin's Hill Farm and Larkin's Hundred and by the Harwood family. The Bird family were in possession of this property from 1820 to 1965.

This is the house of rural people interested in contributing to their community and over the years little was written about their home or their family. However, their contribution to agriculture and country living has been cooperative.


