DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

CAR-166

Located at 104 South Second Street in Denton, Caroline County, Maryland, the Schoolhouse is a small building, domestic in scale, with a Latin cross plan. The longer arms, each three bays, are parallel to Second Street. The main entrance, which opens from a hall onto the street, is in the northeast arm as is the kitchen; the southwest arm is now a meeting room. A large clubroom extends the entire length of the shorter arms of the cross. Two other entrances are situated in the rear wall of the northeast arm, opening into the kitchen, and the street side of the southwest room, opening into the meeting room.

Although the building has been covered with aluminum siding and an asphalt shingle roof, it still retains architectural details of its Gothic Revival style. The pointed arch windows have four-over-four Gothic sash and shutter blinds with louvered sections over raised panel ones. A few of the window sash have been replaced with ordinary four-over-four sash. The exterior doors have four raised panels each bordered by applied mouldings. "Open work," typical of the period, exists in three of the four gable peaks. Affixed to the roof ridge of the longer sections is an octagonal cupola with a belfry of alternating louvered and plain drop-arched panels. At the top of the cupola is an elaborately cut wooden spire.

The interior of the school is very plain and appears to have not been altered greatly in appearance. The window and door frames are simple four-inch moldings throughout the building and the interior doors are identical to the exterior ones. Each of the rooms contains stock tongue and groove wainscoting topped with a plain chair rail. At each gable end stove chimneys are present, but the stoves have been removed and the pipe holes plastered over. The original pressed tin ceilings in the rooms have been covered with modern suspended ceilings, which could easily be removed.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Located at 104 South Second Street in Denton, Caroline County, the old Schoolhouse is a sizeable, one-story frame building that today serves as a facility for meetings and social gatherings. It was built during the last quarter of the 19th century on a cruciform plan, and incorporates several features of the Gothic Revival style, including windows with pointed arches and decorative work in the gable ends. This use of a plan and style most often found in church architecture gives this schoolhouse an unusual character. The building has played a number of roles in the life of the community since its erection, and although no longer used as a school, it today continues to serve the needs of the residents of Denton.

The Schoolhouse stands on a half-acre lot, part of Square No. 7 of the town, which was conveyed on October 1, 1875, to James E. Douglass, William S. Ridgely and Henry O. Comegys, Commissioners for Caroline County, by Philip W. Downes, Joshua W. Bryant and their wives. This lot stood only a few feet from the site of an earlier frame school building, reputed to be the oldest in the county. According to the records of the Caroline County School Board, the present structure was ready for use by October 15, 1883.

As Denton's population increased after the turn of the century, the educational needs of the town could no longer be met by the frame Schoolhouse. New schools were built and, in 1926, the building on South Second Street was sold by the Board of Education to the Denton Community Club, Inc. Aside from using the Schoolhouse as their headquarters, the Community Club maintained a library in the south room of the building between 1935 and 1962, when the present Caroline County Public Library was built on Market Street in Denton. The Denton Community Club is now known as the Woman's Club of Denton, but the organization continues to occupy the old Schoolhouse, maintaining the building and grounds with great care.

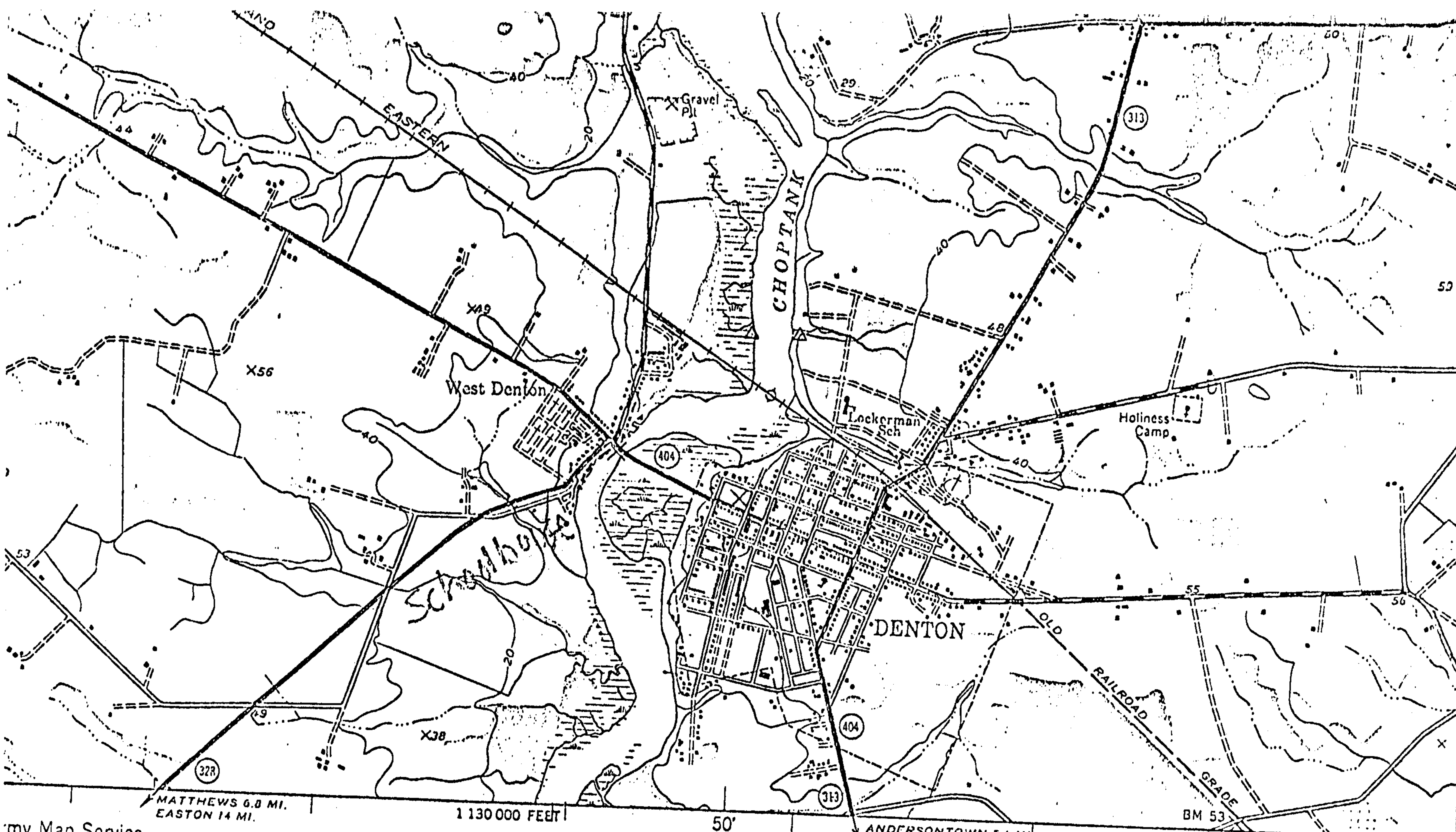

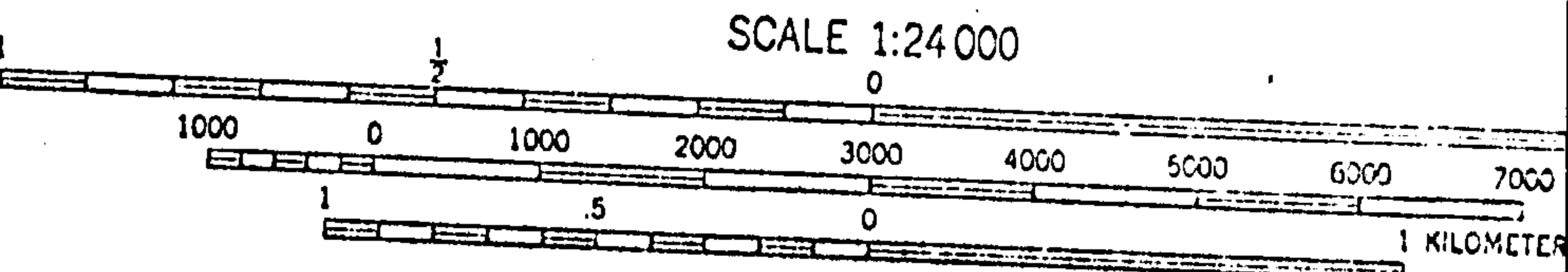

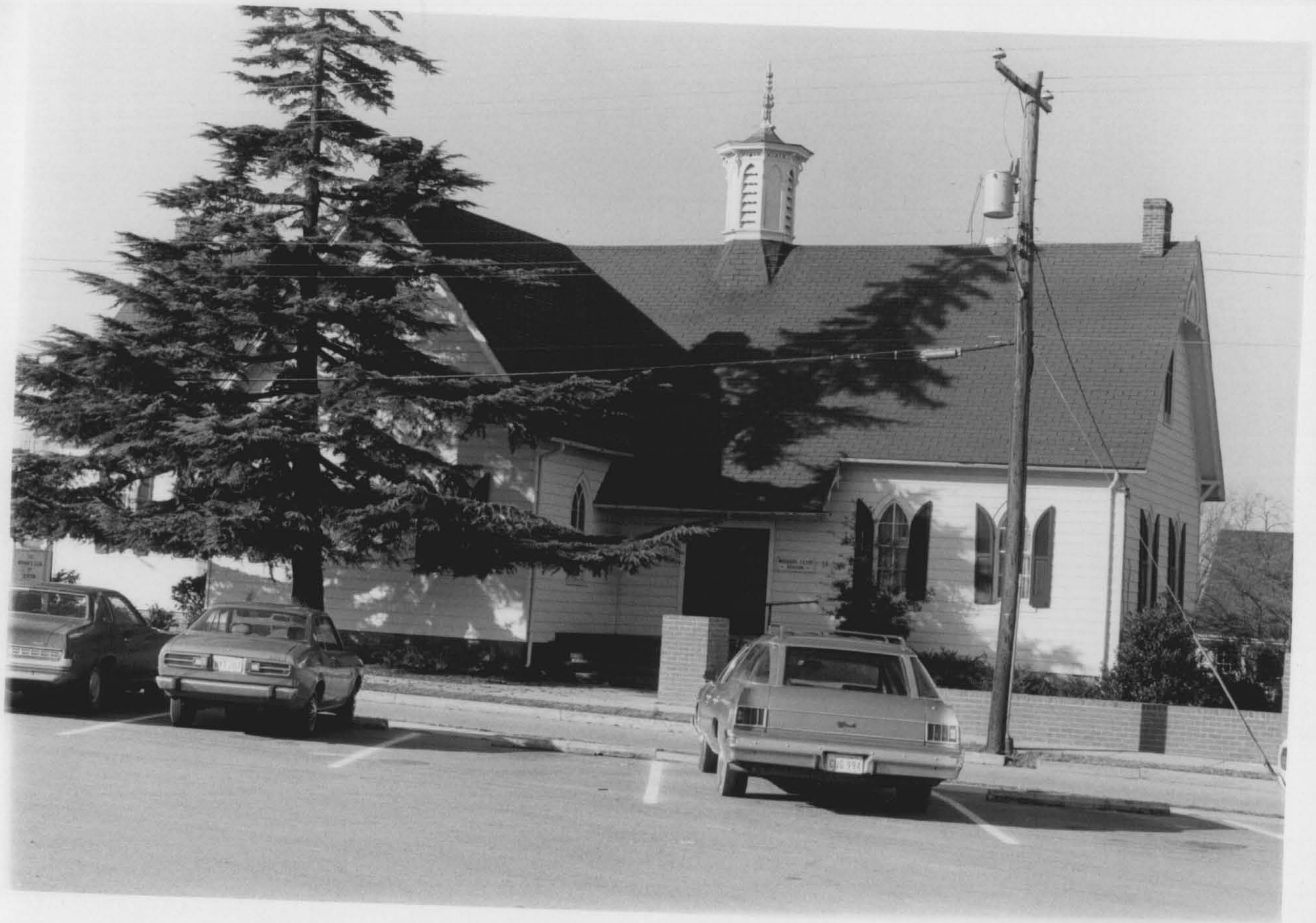
