DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Robert Jager House is a 2 story plus attic frame house of the late nineteenth century located on the east side of Washington Street in Leonardtown, Maryland.

The house has a gable roof and a three bay front elevation with a central pedimented gable. A one-story shed roofed porch extends across the front and north side of the house. A two-story extension, probably contemporary with the main section adjoins the north east corner of the house and a smaller, probably modern addition adjoins the extension.

Two interior chimneys break the roof line at the rear of the house. Wood finials project from the gable peaks of the roof. The front gable is shingled and has a pointed window. A cornice with perforated brackets extends around the main block. The porch has turned columns and scroll sawn brackets. The entry in the north bay has a transom and sidelights. The windows have cornices in the main block and green shutters flank all windows. The sash is modern 2/2 configuration. The exterior is weatherboard and the roofing material is modern.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Jager House is a good example of the vernacularized Queen Anne house in the late nineteenth century. It retains the "doughnut" brackets popular during the 1870's. and the "gothic" pointed arch gable window found in many houses of the period.


