Description of Property and Eligibility Determination *(Use continuation sheet if necessary and attach map and photo)*

The Donaldson House, constructed c. 1896, is a typical two story I-house with a rear ell. The main/north façade is three bays wide while the north and south facades are one bay wide. The two-story rear ell extends along the west gable and ends at a one story shed roof addition. The windows are 2/2 double hung sash with storm windows over top. A one-story, three-quarter width porch covers the first floor of the main façade. It exhibits slim columns and modern wood railing. The siding was once wood clapboard but has been replaced with new vinyl siding. A modern second floor deck is visible on the east façade at the rear of the building.

Typical of modest vernacular houses in late nineteenth century Prince George's County, the Donaldson House was built in the unrealized subdivision of Oakcrest, platted by Thomas Waggaman in 1890. Oakcrest was to extend north from Contee Station with lots 50 by 150 feet. David Donaldson purchased three adjoining lots and constructed a house on the easternmost of the three. Donaldson defaulted on his loan and the house and remaining lots were transferred to William Reed. The community of Oakcrest floundered and did not develop according to its original plan. The area has built-up more recently with modern ranch houses in the subdivision and commercial development




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

Description:

The Donaldson house is an L-shaped gable-roofed frame house which stands in the subdivision of Oakcrest. The two-and-one-half-story main block is a typical I-house, three bays by one bay, and has a one-bay wing extending to the rear. The house faces roughly north, and entrance is in the central bay of the three-bay (main) north facade, through a door with a transom light. Across this north facade is a one-story porch with slim Tuscan columns. Windows are 2/2 double hung sash and have narrow molded surrounds. Cornices are boxed and have crown molding; they are not returned at the gable ends. The building is covered with German siding painted white; all trim, including porch columns and corner boards, is painted black. Extending to the rear (south), flush with the west gable end is a one-bay two-story wing, and behind it a one-story shed-roof kitchen addition. A modern one-story shed roofed porch, now enclosed with glass, wraps around the east and south sides of the ell. This house stands on Lot #17 in Block 15 of Oak Crest. To the southeast, at the rear of the adjoining Lot #16, is a one-and-one-half-story frame gable-roofed building, which has been used as a barn and as a tenant dwelling.

Significance:

The Donaldson House is typical of the modest folk housing of the late nineteenth century in Prince George's County. It follows the simple I-house plan: one parlor on each side of a central stairhall, and has a two-story kitchen wing to the rear forming an ell. It stands on a lot in the subdivision of Oakcrest (platted by Thomas Waggaman in 1890), a planned suburb which extended north from Contee Station along the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad; the lots were 50 by 150 feet, and the community included a hotel and pavillion. In 1892, David Donaldson bought two adjoining unimproved lots; four years later he purchased a third, and negotiated a loan for the construction of his house on the eastmost of the three lots. In its first year, the house was assessed at \$400 value, typical of the plain folk housing of that period. Donaldson defaulted on his mortgage, however, and the house and all three lots were sold to William Reed, whose family has owned it from that time until earlier this year. The community of Oakcrest was not fully developed according to its original plan, although the area around it is still developing commercially. The Donaldson house, however, still retains some of its rural suburban atmosphere, with garden and outbuildings at the rear of the deep lot. It is noticeable landmark in a quickly developing area.

The Donaldson house is an L-shaped gable-roofed frame house which stands in the subdivision of Oakcrest. The two-and-one-half-story main block is a typical I-house, three bays by one bay, and has a one-bay wing extending to the rear. The house faces roughly north, and entrance is in the central bay of the three-bay (main) north facade, through a door with a transom light. Across this north facade is a one-story porch with slim Tuscan columns. Windows are 2/2 double hung sash and have narrow molded surrounds. Cornices are boxed and have crown molding; they are not returned at the gable ends. The building is covered with German siding painted white; all trim, including porch columns and corner boards, is painted black. The roof is of asphalt shingle and there is a corbelled brick stove chimney at the ridge between second and third bays. There is no basement; foundations are of concrete surmounted by a course of parged brick.

Extending to the rear (south), flush with the west gable, end is a one-bay two-story wing, and behind it a one-story shed-roof kitchen addition. Entrance to the wing is through a door in its east side, sheltered by an enclosed porch. There was an interior stove chimney at the south gable end of the ell, but it was in ruinous condition and has been removed. A modern one-story shed roofed porch, now enclosed with glass, wraps around the east and south sides of the ell. Windows in the rear elevation of the main block and in the ell are 6/6. A small cellar area has been dug out under the kitchen addition.

This house stands on Lot #17 in Block 15 of Oak Crest. To the southeast, at the rear of the adjoining Lot #16, is a one-and-one-half-story frame gable-roofed building, which has been used as a barn and as a tenant dwelling.

Typical of the modest vernacular housing of the late nineteenth century in Prince George's County, the Donaldson house retains its original lot size and much of its architectural integrity; it has remained in the same family for 85 years. It is a two-story frame I-house, following the simple plan of one parlor in each side of a central stairhall; a two-story kitchen wing to the rear forms an ell.

The house stands on a lot in the subdivision of Oakcrest which was platted by Thomas Waggaman in 1890. Oakcrest was a planned suburb which extended north from Contee Station on the west side of the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad; the lots were 50 by 150 feet, and the community included a hotel and pavillion.<sup>1</sup> In 1892, David Donaldson bought two adjoining unimproved lots; four years later he purchased a third, and negotiated a loan for the construction of his house on the eastmost of the three lots.<sup>2</sup> In its first year, the house was assessed at \$400 value, typical of the plain folk housing of that period. Donaldson defaulted on his payments, however, and the Laurel Building Association (which held his mortgage) sold the house and all three lots to William Reed, whose family has owned it from 1899 until earlier this year.<sup>3</sup>




