Description Summary

The house at 1103 Haverford Road (Block 4, Lot 6, New Hampshire Avenue Highlands) is a two-story, brick Dutch Colonial house with a rectangular plan and a slate-covered gambrel roof. The house is composed of a five-bay, center-entrance main block flanked by a one-story, side-gable addition to the east and a two-story, gambrel roof addition to the west. Throughout the house windows are multi-pane, wood-frame double-hung sash; on the main (north) facade windows are flanked by decorative wood shutters. The center bay entrance door is concealed by a flat roof multi-pane wood and glass vestibule. The house retains its early character and many of its original exterior features.

Significance Summary

The house at 1103 Haverford Road, constructed c. 1940, is an excellent example of the Dutch Colonial Revival style, popular throughout the 1920s and 1930s. The various substyles of the Colonial Revival were the most popular building forms in the years immediately before World War II in the then developing areas of Takoma Park, including New Hampshire Avenue Highlands and Hillwood Manor. Groups of houses like 1103 Haverford Road were built speculatively as a comprehensively developed subdivision. Typically, these pre-war neighborhoods are characterized by groups of related houses that are slight modifications of a limited number of interior plans and exterior decorative schemes. 1103 Haverford Road is a Contributing Resource in the proposed Takoma Park Historic District.
