

The Berwyn Historic District is representative of late 19<sup>th</sup> and early 20<sup>th</sup> century suburbanization of Prince George's County. An outgrowth of both the arrival of the streetcar and later of broader ownership of automobiles, Berwyn retains its integrity of location and the architectural development of Prince George's County's suburban communities of the period. Early examples tend to be larger in massing and greater in expression, set on somewhat larger lots and somewhat greater spacing; later examples tend to be somewhat smaller in scale, set on smaller lots and more closely spaced. Bungalows and other pattern book houses are well represented.

Berwyn was developed as a suburb of Washington, DC beginning at the turn of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, at which time land lots were being purchased and built upon. Early examples were built on larger lots and are more substantial than those that followed, combining vernacular Queen Anne and late Victorian design elements. Examples are generally frame dwellings (although some are of rock-faced, concrete block or other masonry construction) of two or two-and-a-half stories, centered on their lots with uniform set back and orientation to the street. Many of the early houses have an L-shaped plan, and are essentially two I-houses connected perpendicularly at their ends. Often the street-facing gable-end of the dwellings are dressed with a one-story porch that wraps from the gable-end around the side elevation to the perpendicular mass. 4800 Tecumseh is a rock-faced, concrete block, two-and-a-half story version of this plan. Diamond-shaped windows are set in the gables. The footprint of the dwelling at 4900 Ruatan is the same, although the structure is clad in clapboard and set on a raised basement. Two-and-a-half story four squares are well-represented, as with the examples at 4803 and 4807 Ruatan Street.

Elsewhere in the district bungalows, with a variety of relatively understated architectural expressions, and simple one-and-a-half story gable front dwelling predominate. The example at 8802 48<sup>th</sup> Avenue is representative of these smaller, later dwellings. This one-and-a-half story gable front has a small, raised porch protecting the entry of this unpretentious, unadorned three-bay dwelling. A large shed dormer has been added, expanding the living space of the half-story. Along streets shaded with mature trees, the setback throughout the district is uniform on well-landscaped lots.

The Berwyn Historic District, located approximately two miles north of College Park, MD and situated east of U.S. Route 1, is significant as an example of the early suburbanization of Prince George's County. Originally agrarian in use, the land that became Berwyn near the turn of the 20<sup>th</sup> century was originally part of a land grant given to Col. Isaac Walker in 1745.<sup>1</sup>

The Berwyn Historic District is situated east of U.S. Route 1 in Prince George's County, approximately two miles north of College Park, MD. The district includes a collection of 122 resources (of which 113 contribute to the historic district), which when taken as a whole retain significance for representing the initial era of suburbanization in Prince George's County that occurred during the period when land use was switching from agricultural use to focus to a residential development focused on Washington, DC-oriented commuters.

The region's Colonial history has a strong agrarian, plantation culture. In 1745, Col. Isaac Walker received the earliest documented land grant in the area. Col. Walker erected Toaping Castle, his plantation manor, just north of the present-day Greenbelt Road, the northern boarder of the district. Route 1, just to the west of the district, has long been a transportation corridor. A stage coach ran along the corridor, connecting Washington and Baltimore. Access to transportation, exceptionally rich soil, and abundant water supplied by many tributaries and minor streams combined to make the area attractive for cultivation and by the the beginning of the Revolution agriculture was well-established. Development along the corridor was spurred in 1827 when the Maryland General Assembly granted the Baltimore and Ohio railroad a right-of-way through the area.

John and Jane Bewley purchased three-hundred acres of land, property that came to be known as Higgins Farm, and which would become Berwyn. By the 1880s the family had constructed a saw mill on the Pain Branch and began to harvest the area's vast tracts of timber. At the conclusion of the 19<sup>th</sup> century, a transplanted Pennsylvanian named Francis Shannabrook purchased Higgins Farm. According to *History and Development of the City of College Park, Berwyn Heights, Greenbelt and Adjacent Areas*, "Shannabrook subdivided his land, erected a store building near the railroad, and built about 15 homes, all on the west side of the railroad. He named the subdivision 'Central Heights'".

During the last quarter of the 19<sup>th</sup> century substantial real estate development occurred in the formerly agrarian region northeast of Washington, DC. As real estate speculation took over, agricultural land-use waned and subdivisions and suburban communities emerged, changing the landscape of swaths of Prince George's County near the boarder of Washington and along transportation routes. Shannabrook's Central Heights was part of this changing landscape. By the last years of the 19<sup>th</sup> century, a well-defined suburban corridor stretched from Washington, DC to Branchville in Prince George's County, just north of what was to become Berwyn. In 1897, Central Heights was renamed Berwyn and a streetcar station was constructed. By 1900 the Washington and Suburban Railroad operated an electric carline to Berwyn, which furthered suburban development in this corridor of Prince George's County. The station was located near Berwyn Road and Rhode Island Avenue, at what would become the heart of the community. With the arrival of the rail line, Berwyn grew aggressively during the first decades of the 20<sup>th</sup> century as lots were purchased and dwellings erected.

Although many of the resources within the district have been altered with modern cladding and some have been enlarged, the Berwyn Historic District retains its integrity and context and continues to express its origins as a late 19<sup>th</sup> and early 20<sup>th</sup> century Prince George's County commuter suburb.

The western boundary is formed by 48<sup>th</sup> Avenue, the rear of lots on the west side of 48<sup>th</sup> Place, and Maryland Rt 1 at Greenbelt Avenue.
