Description

The Martina Miller House is a 2 1/2-story frame dwelling of I-house form, with flush central crossgable on the main north facade. Original wood siding is covered with white synthetic siding with brown trim. The house has a red standing-seam roof. The one-story hip-roof porch has tapered paneled posts on molded concrete block bases.

Significance

This is a good example of a frame I-House, one of four surviving dwellings of this type in the oldest section of Brentwood. It was built on Baker Street in the Brentwood subdivision, for the family of Martina Miller in 1903. The house is a noticeable reminder of the earliest buildings in the community.


