Description

The Lightbown House is a large 2 1/2 story hip-roof frame dwelling of Foursquare plan. Entrance is in the second bay of the four-bay main north facade; there is a one-story hip-roof wraparound porch which shelters parts of both the north and east elevations. The original wood siding is covered by narrow synthetic siding, light green on the second story and white on the first. The hip roof is covered with standing seam metal, and there is a hip dormer centered in the north plane.

Significance

The Lightbown House is a good example of the American Foursquare dwelling, one of only four surviving examples from the earliest building period in Brentwood. It was built in 1904 for the family of Charles Lightbown. Lightbown bought many lots from the developers of Brentwood, and developed them as investment properties. He was also involved in the design and construction of several local school buildings. The Lightbown House stands in a prominent location, on an unusually large triangular lot formed by one of the diagonal streets which give the Brentwood subdivision its variety in plan.


