
3402-3412 Rhode Island is a two-story, four bay yellow brick commercial building with a rectangular plan (see slides #50,51). A molded, concrete or stone cornice surmounts a horizontal parapet concealing a flat roof. The first story of the main (south) facade has been unsympathetically modernized with a brown brick facing. There are four single wood and glass entry doors, two centered on the facade and two at the interior edges of the east and west bays. There are two horizontal plate glass windows flanking the center bay entrances that are probably not original but date to the modernization of the first story facade.

The second story main facade maintains its original yellow brick, stone or concrete detailing and fenestration. The two western bays contain three evenly-spaced 1/1 sash double-hung wood frame windows. The two eastern bays mirror one another and contain a triple 1/1 sash double-hung window to the outside and a similarly configured single window to the inside. Across the second story a stone or concrete string course unites the windows as a sill. Separating the first and second and third and fourth bays of the second story is a raised concrete or stone vertical detail that extends below the string course and is incorporated with the molded parapet above. The parapet is surmounted by a molded cap with a repeating low-relief geometric design. The building is attached to the east and freestanding on the west (alley) facade. The west facade is sheathed in red brick and fenestrated only at the second story with two widely spaced 1/1 sash double-hung windows.
