The building is typical of small commercial buildings of its period ca. 1950s. It fits the scale of other small commercial buildings in the area, and appear to have been designed for the space.

The property on which this building sits was purchased from the Gulf Oil Corporation in 1944. It has always been in a strategic location for commercial purposes, located not far from Baltimore Ave (Rt 1) and Queensbury Road one of the main roads to the center of Riverdale.

The structure represents rather insignificant architecture and has no discernible historic significance.
