

Prepare both a summary paragraph and a general description of the resource and its various elements as it exists today.

This 1930's frame commercial structure with brick veneer was originally constructed as a Texaco Service station. The two story central portion of the building is done in a "cottage" or "domestic" style similar to the standardized plans used by Texaco during this time.

The building presently has three garage bays located to one side of the central "cottage" section of the building. The cottage section of the building has a steep cross gabled roof and slate roofing.

The original appearance of the facade of the building has been altered in a number of respects. Large windows on the front of the building have been replaced with plywood panels. The building has been painted so that no remnants of the original signs or color scheme remain. It also appears likely that some portions of the one story section of the building are later additions.

This building is significant both as a surviving (although altered) example of the domestic style service station and as an illustration of the rapid spread in the 1930s of car related services away from Hyattsville along Rt. 1.

The station was constructed by George B. Furman (owner/builder) at the same time and in the same style as the small shopping center adjacent to it at 4806-4816 Rhode Island Ave. Furman was a tax attorney who was involved in a number of other local buildings-both commercial and residential. The warehouse/industrial buildings directly behind the gas station were constructed by Furman immediately after completing the station.

During this time many service related facilities were constructed in a similar "domestic" style so as to blend more harmoniously with the architecture of surrounding neighborhoods. According to one source Furman took the idea one step further and had apartments above the station.

The building remained in use as a gas station until the 1960's when it was converted to its present use as a radiator repair shop.
