
The house at 3708 Bladensburg Road is not eligible due to the fact that it does not meet National Register Criteria A, B, C, or D. Preliminary research has not revealed any association between the dwelling and events that have made a significant contribution to the broad patterns of our history (Criterion A) or the lives of persons significant in our past (Criterion B). Although the building provides an example of a Craftsman-style bungalow, it is neither unusual nor distinguished; it does not represent the work of a master or display high artistic merit (Criterion C). There is no evidence that the property is likely to yield information important in history or prehistory (Criterion D). Thus, the property is not National Register-eligible.

CAPSULE SUMMARY
3708 Bladensburg Road
(PG 68-88)

The dwelling at 3708 Bladensburg Road was erected for Charles and Annie P. Fleishman around 1925. Designed in the Craftsman-style of architecture, this modest Bungalow is typical of the numerous single-family frame dwellings erected in Cottage City between 1915 and 1930. Although altered, the building retains its original form, several of its original windows, and portions of Craftsman-style detailing. The building's prominent location along a major transportation route has subjected it to many modifications during its transformation from domestic to commercial use.

The two-and-a-half-story, two-bay wide dwelling was designed as a Craftsman-style Bungalow.¹

Set on a solid, parged concrete foundation, the wood frame house has been reclad in aluminum siding. A side gable roof, clad in asphalt shingles, with front and rear shed roof dormers covers the dwelling. A tall interior brick chimney, parged with concrete, rises above the northern portion of the roof.

The 1915 to 1930, two-and-a-half-story, two-bay wide dwelling at 3708 Bladensburg Road was designed as a Craftsman-style Bungalow.¹ Set on a solid, parged concrete foundation, the wood frame house has been reclad in aluminum siding. A side gable roof, clad in asphalt shingles, with front and rear shed roof dormers covers the dwelling. A tall interior brick chimney, parged with concrete, rises above the northern portion of the roof.

The house is set on a dramatic rise above Bladensburg Road. It sits to the northeast boundary of a moderate sized lot. A fence demarcates the northwest, southwest and southeast edges of the property. Although the southeastern portion of the property is grassy, an asphalt paved parking lot dominates the rest of the site.

EXTERIOR DESCRIPTION:

Although currently no entrance exists on the southeast elevation, historically, this was the facade of the building. This one-and-one-half-story elevation was altered dramatically. The original shed roof dormer with decorative exposed rafter tails is extant, but the one-story porch was enclosed with vertical board siding and commercial signage was added. Four replacement 1/1 windows were added to the enclosed porch. Four original 2/2 windows are located within the dormer above. These windows, like the enclosed porch windows below, are grouped in pairs. All of the windows have wood surrounds.

The northeast gable end of the dwelling is two and a half stories in height and three-bays wide. The gable is detailed with fishscale wood shingles and a wide overhanging eave. The enclosed porch is visible to the east. A one-story, one-bay wide, projecting box bay occupies the eastern end of this elevation. The northeast elevation of the porch is pierced by a single non-original metal paneled door with a wood surround. Openings occur in a random pattern on the first and second stories of the house.

The projecting bay, which sits between the first and second stories, is pierced by a 2/2 original window. A group of two windows, one 1/1 replacement and one boarded-up window, are located below the projecting bay to the north. Above the projecting bay to the north, one original 2/2 and one 1/1 replacement window pierce the second story. A multi-light fixed window was added to the northern end of this elevation. At the gable end, a 1/1 replacement window pierces the elevation. All of the windows have wood surrounds.

The northwest elevation is currently the principal elevation. It is one-and-one-half stories with a shed roof wall dormer. The entry, located towards the north corner of the building, is marked by a single flush wood door with a wood surround. A metal structure, located against the dwelling, conceals the majority of the foundation. On the north side, the first story is pierced by a pair of non-original single-light fixed wood windows. To the east, a non-original single-light fixed wood window, with a four-light transom, is flanked by two four-light fixed wood sidelights. The two sets of paired replacement windows in the upper story consist of four 1/1 windows. All of the windows on this elevation have wood surrounds.

The southwest elevation is two-and-one-half stories in height and two bays wide. Fishscale shingles and wide overhanging eaves adorn the gable. The first story of this elevation is pierced by two original 2/2 windows. One original 2/2 window and one replacement 1/1 window occupy the second story. The gable is marked by one replacement 1/1 window. All of the windows have wood surrounds.

OUTBUILDINGS:

A 1950s shed roof garage sits to the northwest of the main dwelling. The garage is a one-story, one-bay wide, parged concrete block building. The southeast elevation is pierced by roll-up garage doors with decorative wood horizontal planking above. Large multi-light casement windows dominate the northeast face of the building.

The dwelling at 3708 Bladensburg Road was erected for Charles and Annie P. Fleishman around 1925. Although altered, the building retains its original form, several of its original windows, and portions of Craftsman-style detailing. The building's prominent location along a major transportation route has subjected it to many modifications during its transformation from domestic to commercial use.

The property is located within the town of Cottage City, which was gradually developed between 1915 and 1930. The Highlands Company, incorporated in 1888, purchased approximately sixty-four acres of land lying between the B&O Railroad line and the Baltimore-Washington Turnpike; an area then known as "The Highlands."² In May 1906, the full sixty-four-acre tract was sold to three men, J. Harris Rogers, James C. Rogers, and Richard N. Ryon, who had the area platted under the name "Cottage City" in 1906.³ Despite its accessibility to downtown Washington, DC via the Bladensburg Road electric streetcar line, several efforts to develop the area failed. It was not until 1915 that Charles M. Lightbown, who had begun buying up lots in the newly platted town in 1906, borrowed money to construct five modest frame "cottages" which he sold to working-class families.⁴ By 1925, the town of Cottage City had developed into a substantial suburb with access to the District of Columbia via Bladensburg Road and the B&O Railroad. Today, the town contains over 322 single- and dual-family dwellings and around thirty apartment units.

In 1925, Charles and Annie Fleishman purchased three lots in Cottage City from Edwin and Katherine Spalding. Prior to this purchase, salesman Charles Fleishman was listed in *Nelson's Washington Suburban Directory* of 1923 as living at the corner of Washington-Baltimore Boulevard and Barney Street, present-day Bladensburg Road and 38th Avenue.⁵ In 1930, Fleishman appeared in the city directory as a policeman, living at 100 Washington-Baltimore Boulevard, present-day 3708 Bladensburg Road.⁶ The directory also noted that Fleishman was living with his wife Anna and three relatives, all policemen.

The Fleishmans continued to own the property at 3708 Bladensburg Road until 1941, when Charles Fleishman, now a widower, sold it to Randall D. and Mary A. Foster. The Fosters sell the property in 1948 to Joseph and Leo Dal Maso, who immediately reconveyed it to Victoria V. and Victor F. Mariani. The Mariani family held the property for seventeen years. In 1965, Arthur R. and Blanche B. Young purchased the property, retaining it for ten years. The current owners, Thomas and Patricia Bonacorda, who own the adjacent three properties, purchased 3708 Bladensburg Road in July 1975.




SKETCH MAP


