STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

One of the oldest and largest cemeteries in the area. There are many old tombstones here that give important genealogical information. This was the site of one of the earliest Presbyterian Churches in the country. The Scots who had settled at Bladensburg had organized Presbyterian meetings in the area as early as 1706.
