Description:

The Magruder house is a two-and-one-half story frame gable-roofed building, its main section approximately 30 feet square. Entrance is in the third bay of the east facade. A short distance to the west of the house is an 18 foot square kitchen building, formerly a separate structure, but now connected to the main house by a two-story sitting-room addition. At the south gable end of the main house are two large free-standing brick chimneys, with corbelled caps. The roof of this section is standing-seam metal, painted green. The Magruder house has undergone considerable alteration in recent years. In the 1940's a one-story addition was built to connect the main house to the kitchen. In 1960, the new owners raised this one-story connector to a full two stories; they covered the main section with synthetic siding; a one-story wing was extended to the north; brick veneer was added to the main east facade, and the former one-story Victorian porch at this location was replaced by a two-story columned portico. The interior also had been significantly changed, with removal of some partitions and mantels.

Significance:

The Magruder house represents an early nineteenth century dwelling house which has been significantly altered. The main section of the house was built soon after 1800 by Thomas Magruder on his farm known as "The Forest", located on part of Darnall's Grove. This frame house was located within a few yards of the old homestead and tavern operated by Thomas Baldwin, grandfather of Thomas Magruder. The farm passed in the mid-1860's to Magruder's son, Caleb Clarke Magruder I, prominent Upper Marlboro attorney; he in turn passed it to his son of the same name in 1871. In 1898, the old Baldwin homestead/tavern was demolished, and a kitchen was constructed on part of its stone foundation. In 1916, Magruder deeded this house and 60 acres to his son, C.C. Magruder III. The property passed out of the Magruder family in 1945, after which the new owner constructed the addition which connected the main house to the kitchen. Further alterations were undertaken by the present owners. For nearly a century and a half this house was owned by members of one of Prince George's County's most prominent families. Since 1960, modern renovations have destroyed much of its original character. It is now a spacious and very livable country house but it is scarcely recognizable as a nineteenth century structure.

The Magruder house is a two-and-one-half story frame gable-roofed building, its main section approximately 30 feet square. Entrance is in the third bay of the (main) east facade. A short distance to the west (rear) of the house is an 18 foot square kitchen building, formerly a separate structure, but now connected to the main house by a two-story sitting-room addition.

At the south gable end of the main house are two large free-standing brick chimneys, with corbelled caps. The roof of this section is standing-seam metal, painted green.

The Magruder house has undergone considerable alteration in recent years. Up until 1945 it consisted of the main 30'x30' frame dwelling house, and the separate kitchen building which rested on foundations of large iron-bearing local sandstone. In the 1940's the new owner built the one-story addition which connects the two structures. The present owners began the most recent alterations ca. 1960: they raised the one-story connector to a full two stories; they covered the main section with synthetic siding; a one-story wing was extended to the north; brick veneer was added to the main east facade, and the former one-story Victorian porch at this location was replaced by a two-story columned portico. The 6/9 full-length windows on this east facade have shutters.

The interior of the main section originally consisted of front and back parlors on the south, and stair hall on the north. The partitions between these spaces have been partially removed, thus providing more open living area; the parlor mantels at the fireplaces on the west (exterior) wall have been removed, and replaced by a painted brick facing.

The Magruder house represents an early nineteenth century dwelling house which has been significantly altered. The main section of the house was built soon after 1800 by Thomas Magruder on his farm known as "The Forest", located on part of Darnall's Grove. This frame house was located within a few yards of the old homestead and tavern operated by Thomas Baldwin, grandfather of Thomas Magruder. The farm passed in the mid-1860's to Magruder's son, Caleb Clarke Magruder I, prominent Upper Marlboro attorney; he in turn passed it to his son of the same name in 1871. In 1898, during the ownership of C.C. Magruder II, the old Baldwin homestead/tavern was demolished, and a kitchen was constructed on part of its stone foundation.¹ In 1916, Magruder deeded this house and 60 acres to his son, C.C. Magruder III, who occupied it as a summer home. The property passed out of the Magruder family in 1945, after which the new owner constructed the addition which connected the main house to the kitchen. Further alterations were undertaken by the present owners.²

For nearly a century and a half this house was owned by members of one of Prince George's County's most prominent families. After the first generation, however, it was apparently not their year-round home. Since 1960, modern renovations have destroyed much of its original fabric and character. It is now a spacious and very livable country house, indeed an imposing landmark, but it is scarcely recognizable as a nineteenth century structure.


