DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This was a large, two-story, Federal-style frame house, built in 3 sections. The main section had large, brick, double-end chimneys on the east end. The bases were enclosed by a low, one-story kitchen wing that had a large external stone chimney. Adjoining the main section, on the west, was a lower, two-story wing of similar styling. In the yard nearby is an old Bowie family graveyard. The graves, including the brick-lined crypts, have been extensively vandalized in recent years. The house itself was standing in very poor condition in 1972.

West of here, on Rte. 450, nearly opposite Hillmeade Rd., is an old tobacco barn with a steeply-pitched roof, that once belonged to this farm.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This was an old Bowie family plantation of considerable architectural and historical merit. The house was recorded by HABS in 1936. The graveyard includes the remains of "Wat" Bowie, a famous member of Mosby's Confederate Raiders in the Civil War. His exploits were as legendary as Mosby's, but he was killed in an ambush after a raid in nearby Montgomery County.
