The Mitchellville School is a one-story, hip-roofed, frame structure with entrance into the center bay of the nine-bay east (main) facade. There are four long windows (now boarded up) on each side of the round arched on this east facade. The school is built on a slope, and rests on a ^{full basement} ~~high~~ foundation. There is a brick chimney near the south end of the west slope of the roof.



During the first decades which followed the Civil War, there were two schools built for black children in the Queen Anne (7th) Election District: Mt. Nebo School near Queen Anne town, and Collington School near the village of that name. ~~After the turn of the century, another school was built near the Mitchellville Post Office, but~~ In the 1920's when the Rosenwald Fund was building rural schools for black children, it was decided to build a larger school ~~nearly a mile south, on the way to~~ ^{near} Carroll Chapel, a small black Methodist Church. A two acre parcel was purchased in the spring of 1930, and the contractor, Henry Chaney, finished the school building before the end of the year. This school served the children of the black community until the period of desegregation, when it was sold at auction. It is a recognizable example of the larger, more substantial school buildings from the Rosenwald period.

* Although it is similar to the Banks School built three years earlier, it is the only surviving school of this period which has a full basement.
