Located in Landover, the dwelling at 8201 Barlowe Road exhibits several different construction periods, beginning in the 1930s with a one & a half story core. Three additions create the existing massing and combination of historic and modern materials like German siding and synthetic vertical board. Because of the expansions/alterations, the building does not appear to retain much integrity. It does not possess characteristics to qualify it for the National Register. There does not appear to be a concentration of historic properties surrounding the house either.

Prepare both a summary paragraph and a general description of the resource and its various elements as it exists today.

The house at 8201 Barlowe Road is a multi-part structure of which the nucleus was a small gable-roof dwelling one and one-half stories high; it was of frame construction, sheathed with German siding, and rested on a concrete-block foundation. This modest cottage probably dates to the period shortly before World War II. Over the years, several additions were constructed: a one-and-one-half-story ell wing extending to the side (east), from which a long south shed-roof addition was built on a high concrete-block basement, and another gabled extension, also on a high basement, was built to the west. Probably the last addition was a small one-story flat-roof section which fills in the northwest corner of the building. The various elevations of this multi-section building are covered with either German siding or synthetic vertical-board siding.

This small dwelling was built on the slope just north of the Cattail Branch; consequently the southerly additions are built into the slope, and rest on high basement foundations.



The house at 8201 Barlowe Road is a complex structure, which began as a simple one-and-one-half-story frame cottage, and was subsequently enlarged by a sequence of additions. These sequential additions were not part of any over-all plan, but seem to have been constructed almost randomly. The resulting building stands in an attractive setting, but has no architectural integrity. As an individual building, it cannot be considered eligible for listing in the National Register.
