Based on the information prepared by Prince George's County government and our records, 522 Dateleaf Avenue does not appear to meet any of the National Register Criteria for Evaluation. The very modest bungalow-type house is an extremely common type throughout the state and particularly in the numerous early 20th century suburbs surrounding Washington, D.C. The house at 522 Dateleaf Avenue is not a particularly good representative of the type. It has undergone alterations including the replacement of its porch posts and railings. 522 Dateleaf Avenue is not located in any known National Register historic district.




