Summary Paragraph

The Fairmount Heights Historic District is a twentieth-century residential suburb located in western Prince George's County, clustered around the eastern corner of the District of Columbia, and surrounded by mixed residential, commercial, and industrial uses. The historic district consists of approximately 558 properties constructed in six subdivisions on approximately 144 acres of land between 1900 and 2010. The terrain in and around Fairmount Heights is sloped. The majority of properties are single-family dwellings that were constructed between 1900 and 1960. Dwellings types common in the subdivision include two-story gable-front and shed-roof dwellings with narrow footprints, bungalows, and small one- and one-and-one-half-story side gable and gable-front dwellings. Overall, stylistic detailing is minimal and includes features of the Colonial Revival, Craftsman, and Tudor styles. In addition to dwellings, the community retains a school, five churches, a commemorative marker, and a social hall.

Statement of Significance Summary Paragraph (provide a summary paragraph that includes level of significance and applicable criteria)

The Fairmount Heights Historic District is significant under Criterion A in the areas of community planning and development, ethnic heritage, and politics and government, as outlined in the *African-American Historic Resources of Prince George's County, Maryland Multiple Property Documentation Form*. Fairmount Heights is among the earliest planned communities for African Americans in the Washington, D.C. area. The layout, dwelling types and construction methods found in the community illustrate patterns typical of early twentieth-century African-American residential suburbs. Successful endeavors of the town's citizens, including the erection of a town hall in 1908 and the construction of the first African-American public elementary school in Prince George's County in 1912, are illustrative of successful efforts at self-government. The town retains five churches, a community hall, and school that served as social and political centers for the area during segregation. The community was a center of political activism and progressivism throughout the early twentieth century, with regular features in local African-American newspapers. During this period, Fairmount Heights was also the home of several notable African-Americans who made significant political and social contributions to the town and Prince George's County. The extant residential buildings and community institutions reflect the continued growth of the community through the mid-twentieth century. To the present, Fairmount Heights is a thriving residential community.

Narrative Statement of Significance (provide at least one paragraph for each area of significance)

Community Planning and Development

In the area of community planning and development, Fairmount Heights conveys the development patterns of the earliest African-American subdivisions in Prince George's County. The scattered placement of the dwellings within the subdivision was typical of African-American suburbs of the early twentieth century. Lots were often sold and dwellings were erected as the financial means of the owners allowed. A notable exception to this pattern of development is the bungalows that line 62nd Avenue, which were constructed in the 1920s by developer Robinson White for sale and rental to African Americans. In addition, Fairmount Heights retains nearly standard lot sizes measuring 25 by 150 feet, a reflection of the tendency of African-American subdivisions to be marketed in the form of small, affordable lots that could be combined depending on the size of the dwelling. The pattern of streets and original size of the lots also remains. Finally, although it was first platted four years later than North Brentwood, the community of Fairmount Heights evolved to be nearly three times greater in size and retains a greater number of non-residential buildings that were erected to serve the community.¹

Ethnic Heritage

In the area of ethnic heritage, Fairmount Heights was settled by African Americans seeking home ownership in a community that would allow them control over their lives. The early owners worked together to develop their own political and social institutions as a safe haven from the hostility brought about by segregation. Surviving community places, such as the school, churches, Charity Hall, the World War II monument, and commercial establishments, provided services to the community and convey the web of kinship and solidarity that the local citizenry developed in the face of segregation. The physical changes to the dwellings and the replacement of earlier dwellings with more recent houses convey the restrictions of segregation: African

Americans commonly remodeled or replaced houses rather than buying new dwellings outside of their established community. The community of Fairmount Heights has been continuously occupied by African Americans since the time of its initial subdivision in 1900 and incorporation in 1935.

Politics and Government

In the area of politics and government, the Fairmount Heights Historic District contains the houses of a number of notable individuals that played a significant role in the political history of the community and Prince George's County, including William Sidney Pittman and Doswell Brooks. Pittman organized the community's first civic association for the purposes of erecting a social hall and also designed the first community school. Brooks was the first African-American member of the county's Board of Education and was active in local politics, serving as a member of the Fairmount Heights town council and as mayor from 1955 until 1965. The town's proximity to Washington D.C., made it a center of political activity. Early on, the town had a Republican Club that met in the town hall. Historian Bianca Floyd has noted, "the role Fairmount residents played in early African-American politics and voter registration drives is the town's most significant historic asset."²

The boundary includes approximately 144 acres situated on the south side of Sheriff Road, west side of Balsamtree Drive, 62nd Street, and 62nd Place, north of Eastern Avenue. The boundary of the Fairmount Heights Historic District is shown as the dotted line on the accompanying map entitled "Fairmount Heights Historic District."

Boundary Justification (explain why the boundaries were selected)

The boundary includes the six subdivisions that formed the boundary of the town when it was incorporated in 1935 and those associated properties dating between 1900 and 1960. It excludes a small area of the West Fairmount Heights Subdivision located along Kolb and K streets between Sheriff Road and 56th Avenue, which was redeveloped in the 1990s. It also excludes a small portion of the Mount Wiessner Subdivision at the corner of Eastern Avenue and 62nd Place, which is occupied by a large apartment complex.

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General Description

The subdivisions that formed the boundaries for the Town of Fairmount Heights include Fairmount Heights (1900), Waterford (1907), Mount Weissner (1909), North Fairmount Heights (1910), West Fairmount Heights or Bryn Mawr (1911), and Sylvan Vista (1923). Generally, the triangular-shaped historic district includes the boundaries of the original subdivisions and the incorporated Town of Fairmount Heights, excluding small portions of West Fairmount Heights and Mount Weissner that have later, uncohesive residential development. The historic district is bounded by Sheriff Road to the north, Balsamtree Drive and 62nd Place to the east and south, and Eastern Avenue to the south and west. Addison Road runs through the middle of the historic district between Sheriff Road and 62nd Place. The historic district is bordered by suburban residential development, except to the north along Sheriff Road, which contains a large wooded area and county park in the location of a former school, and to the east where the historic district is bordered by Addison Chapel. The incorporated Town of Seat Pleasant is located to the south.

The Fairmount Heights Historic District includes approximately 300 contributing resources, including 281 single-family dwellings, eight commercial buildings, five churches, four multi-family dwellings, one community hall, one school, and one commemorative marker that date from ca. 1900 to 1960. Non-contributing resources in the number 261 and include 245 post-1960 buildings, three post-1960 sites (a playground and two junk car yards), 11 buildings that are no longer recognizable as dating to the period of significance, and two dwellings that are in a state of ruin.

Generally, the earliest and most prominent dwellings occupy the highest points of land in the Fairmount Heights (1900) subdivision. The portion of the historic district southwest of Addison Road is higher than the portion to the northeast, which includes the Sylvan Vista (1923) and Waterford (1907) subdivisions. A branch of Beaver Creek and other small streams run through the historic district. Due to the sloping nature of the terrain, many of the dwellings feature partially exposed basements, some of which are subterranean on one side of the house and entirely exposed on the opposite side.

The historic district is predominately composed of single-family dwellings. The residential development is generally cohesive with small peripheral areas of community buildings (churches, a former school, a modern library, two lodges, and a modern municipal building) and interspersed vacant lots. Isolated areas of infiltration of commercial properties, along or in the vicinity of Eastern Avenue and Addison Road, a 1.8-acre junk car yard located at 5612 J Street, and a small junk car yard at 6118 Kolb Street are exceptions to the dense residential development and related services that characterize the Town of Fairmount Heights. The junk cars are screened from the surrounding residential areas by fencing. There are three public green spaces included within the historic district including a 3.2-acre park at the corner of 56th and Eastern avenues area; the grassy area between 61st Avenue east and west, east of Sheriff Road and west of Kolb Street; and the grass and a small triangular green at the intersection of 59th Avenue and 59th Place. The latter provides the setting for a 1946 monument that commemorates the service of citizens during World War II. In addition, a curbed brick wall, announcing the Town of Fairmount Heights, is located on grassy triangular lot that serves as an entryway to the town from Eastern Avenue. The Sylvan Vista subdivision accommodates green spaces bounded by 60th and 61st avenues

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that date to the 1920s. The historic district also includes multiple undeveloped lots interspersed throughout the various subdivisions that comprise Fairmount Heights.

The triangular shape of the historic district can be attributed to its location at the intersection of Sheriff Road (which runs southwest to northeast) and Eastern Avenue (which runs southeast to northwest). Eastern Avenue is the eastern boundary of the District of Columbia and the dividing line between the District and Prince George's County. Addison Road, which runs southeast to northwest through the historic district, is somewhat meandering, as it follows the route of an earlier rural road. Almost all of the streets have sidewalks. The layout of the streets is reflective of the incremental nature of the suburban development that occurred between 1900 and 1923. The street pattern of Fairmount Heights is largely linear, as was customary in the early twentieth century when most of the suburban development took place. The exception to this street pattern is the curvilinear 60th Avenue (formerly Maple Boulevard), which runs through the middle of the Sylvan Vista (1923) subdivision between Addison Road and Sheriff Road. 60th Avenue intersects with a market circle, and other streets (61st Avenue and K Street) radiate from the circle.

Although Fairmount Heights is composed of six different subdivisions, the original lot sizes were generally rectangular and similar in size, measuring 25-feet wide by 150-feet deep. One exception is the lots in the Mount Weissner (1909) subdivision, which were slightly larger, measuring fifty feet wide, double that of the other subdivisions. House lots of different sizes, shapes, and patterns are generally the result of the irregular layout of streets, such as along the curvilinear 60th Avenue and market circle in the Sylvan Vista portion of the subdivision. In Sylvan Vista, the lots that front on the circle at the intersection of Lee Place and 60th Avenue are larger than the rest of the historic district. There are also a number of larger lots located between 59th Avenue and Addison Road, south of J Street and north of H Street.¹ Given the small size of the original building lots, most properties include two or more side-by-side lots to provide for additional space around the dwelling. The typical property includes two original building lots per dwelling.

Houses in the Fairmount Heights Historic District generally front the street to which the narrow side of the lot is oriented. Therefore, the narrowest elevation typically faces the street. The narrow size of the properties also results in small spaces between houses. The average setback of dwellings from the streets varies. The majority of houses are aligned with one another along their block, thereby displaying a generally uniform setback.

Residential Development

The construction date of dwellings in the six subdivisions often lagged behind the subdivision of the land, with some houses constructed as recently as the last several years. The earliest dwellings date between 1900 and 1920, and include two-story gable-front and shed- roof types, with some limited architectural detailing. Dwellings dating from the 1920-1940 and 1940-1960 periods include one-story and one-and-one-half-story bungalows and side-gable and gable-front dwellings dating from the late 1910s to the early 1950s. In addition,

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there are a number of examples of what appear to be catalog houses. Overall, stylistic detailing is minimal and includes features of the Colonial Revival, Craftsman, and Tudor styles.

Nearly all of the dwellings rest on brick or concrete foundations, some of which are parged; the use of stone is rare. Wood frame is the most common structural system, with exterior walls clad in vinyl, brick, aluminum, formed stone, wood, asbestos, and asphalt shingle. Concrete and cinder block structural systems, usually covered with stucco or brick veneer at the exterior, are also common. Brick construction is less frequent. The roofs are mostly gabled or hipped, although some have flat or shed roofs. Windows are varied types and sizes and include double-hung, fixed-sash, and some picture windows. Many of the windows are aluminum or vinyl replacements. Nearly all of the dwellings have chimney flues of brick. Wood trim, in the form of porch supports, railings, fascia boards, and boxed eaves is present, although most original wood features have been encased in vinyl or aluminum. Cast-metal is commonly used in porch posts and railings and stair railings. A number of the original porches have been fully or partially rebuilt using metal posts. Aluminum awnings are present on approximately five percent of the pre-1960 dwellings. Overall, most of the dwellings in Fairmount Heights have been altered through the application of modern replacement materials and modern additions. Only a small number of dwellings retain both their original form and materials.

Carport additions, detached garages, and outbuildings are uncommon features in this residential community due to the small size of the majority of lots. There are only four multi-family dwellings pre-dating 1960, including duplexes at 708 59th Place and 700 60th Avenue and apartment buildings at 701 59th Place and 726 60th Avenue.

Residential Development, 1900-1920

No buildings or structures from the period prior to the first recorded land subdivision (1900) remain. Approximately thirty percent of the contributing buildings in the historic district date between 1900 and 1920. The earliest residential development is in the Fairmount Heights (1900) and North Fairmount Heights (1910) portions of the community. The earliest residential development in the Fairmount Heights (1900) portion of the historic district is widely scattered, with the most prominent dwellings located on the highest points of land along the east and west sides of 58th (formerly White Avenue), 59th Avenue (formerly Fairmount Avenue), 60th Avenue (formerly Chapel Avenue), and 60th Place (formerly Addison Avenue).

The most common dwellings of this era are frame, measuring two stories in height with narrow footprints of two and three bays in width and at least three bays in depth. It appears most of the dwellings of this era were originally clad in weatherboard siding, although some, including 5603 Addison Road (Dorsey-Bush House, PG: 72-009-48), were clad in stucco. The three prominent dwelling types from this period include the gable front, shed roof, and shed roof with faux mansard. Less common types include the cross gable with intersecting gable roofs and a version with intersecting hipped roofs. A few of the dwellings from this period retain the original Folk Victorian detailing in the form of turned posts and decorative scrollwork.

The gable-front dwelling seems to have been the most common type of the period. The gable-front type features a side-hall entrance, full façade front porch, and cornice returns at the gable ends. The dwellings at 715 59th Place (Isaac Brown House, PG: 72-~~009~~-30) and 604 60th Place (Juliet Hill, Ruth and Richard Brown House, PG:

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72-~~009~~-34) are good examples of the two-story gable front form. Although common prior to 1920, this dwelling type was so conducive to narrow lots that the form continued to be used into the mid-twentieth century.

A more elaborate example of the gable-front type was constructed prior to 1920. The two-and-one-half-story cross-gable dwelling is similar in appearance to the gable-front type but includes a two- to two-and-one-half-story adjoining wing. Examples include 730 60th Avenue (William B. Coles House, PG: 72-009-31), 612 60th Place (John S. Johnson House, PG: 72-009-32), and 708 59th Avenue (Samuel Towles/Lawrence Brooks House, PG: 72-009-27). Generally, these dwellings are more prominent and tend to occupy larger lots, often located at a corner or high point within the historic district. For example, the William B. Coles House was erected ca. 1906 by Ezra and Florence Kemp at the top of 60th Avenue.²

A variation of the cross-gable dwelling is the two-and-one-half story hipped roof dwelling with two- to two-and-one-half story adjoining wing. Examples of this type include 802 58th Avenue (Robert S. Nichols House, PG: 72-~~0090~~-39) and 612 60th Place (John S. Johnson House, PG: 72-~~009~~-32). The Robert S. Nichols House was erected in 1908 by John F. Collins. The dwelling features intersecting hipped roof blocks and a decorative porch with turned post and scrollwork and remains one of the most prominent dwellings in the community today.³

The shed-roof type within the Fairmount Heights Historic District resembles a detached row house. Most of the early shed-roof forms featured bracketed cornices. The brackets have been removed from all but two (1002 58th Avenue and 5700 L Street) of the remaining seven shed-roof forms in the historic district. Those shed roof forms that did not have bracketed cornices were fronted by faux mansard roofs. Examples of the shed-roof with faux mansard type include 712 and 807 58th Avenue and 708 60th Place. One extant example of a duplex with shed roof is found at 708 59th Place.

The Foursquare, with its four-over-four plan and hipped or pyramidal roof, was a less common dwelling type of the 1910s, 1920s, and 1930s. Seven frame examples remain in the original Fairmount Heights subdivision (1900), including 602 60th Place (Cornelius Fonville House, PG: 72-~~009~~-35). Other two-story hipped roof forms are present, including the Henry Pinckney House at 608 60th Place (PG: 72-~~009~~-33). Although the I-house was a popular form in Maryland during this period, its wide and narrow footprint was not conducive to the lots of Fairmount Heights; only one example of the type was identified in the historic district, 720 60th Place.

Residential Development, 1920-1945

Nearly fifty percent of the contributing buildings within the historic district date between 1920 and 1945. The bungalow became a common dwelling type that was widely constructed throughout the community during the

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1920s and 1930s, although a few earlier examples are present. The bungalow house type is typically one- to one-and-one-half stories in height with an integral porch and low-pitched roof with wide overhangs. Many of the bungalows erected in the Fairmount Heights Historic District are the hipped-roofed subtype. The bungalows in the subdivision are typically frame or masonry with weatherboard, synthetic, brick veneer, or stucco siding. Many feature stylistic details common to the Craftsman style including wide overhanging eaves sometimes with wood brackets or exposed rafter tails, tapered square wood columns set on brick or concrete block piers, and dormers. Notable examples include the Doswell Brooks House (6107 Foote Avenue, PG: 72-~~009~~-36) and the Prince Albert House (949 Eastern Avenue, PG: 72-~~009~~-04). A number of the bungalows are a subtype that features a low overhanging, hipped roof with shed-roof front porch and central brick chimney, such as those found at 5516-5522 Addison Road and 5503 to 5507 Jefferson Heights Drive.

The groupings of bungalows along Addison Road and Jefferson Heights Drive and a collection of dwellings along 62nd Avenue, known as Bungalow Row (PG: 72-~~009~~-41), are similar in appearance to the Rosita, a model offered by Sears Roebuck & Company in the 1920s.⁴ Another example of catalog housing is the Prince Albert Washington House at 949 Eastern Avenue (PG: 72-~~009~~-43), which resembles the Westly model also offered by Sears Roebuck & Company in the 1920s.⁵

Other common dwelling forms from this era include the one-story and one-and-one-half-story side-gable dwelling, sometimes called the side-gable cottage. Largely to reduce costs, these houses are small in size and minimal in features and stylistic detailing. Some feature a portico or hood at the main entrance. More elaborate examples include a front-facing gable, sometimes with a large chimney. Colonial Revival details were often applied to the later forms of this era and the next. The most common influences of the Colonial Revival style in Fairmount Heights are gable-front dormers (common to the Cape Cod form), shed-roof dormers, decorative framing around the door, and prominent chimneys. Most of these dwellings were constructed of wood frame, although some are masonry. Wall cladding includes wood or synthetics imitating wood, brick, formed stone, stucco, and a mixture of the materials. Many of the one-story side-gable dwellings rest on raised basements. Examples of the side-gable form include 1001 60th Avenue and 505 62nd Avenue. There are a few examples of dwellings from this era with Tudor influences in the form of steeply pitched cross gables and decorative half timbering (800 60th Avenue).

The one-story and one-and-one-half-story gable-front dwelling that dates to this period is typically three-bays wide by at least three-bays deep and features an offset gable-front porch or hipped- roof full façade porch. The porch of this dwelling type is often supported by tapered square wood posts or columns resting on brick or concrete piers. Sometimes this dwelling presents stylistic features of the Craftsman style in the form of tapered square wood porch posts with bases that continue to the ground level and exposed rafter tails. A variation of the one-story gable-front dwelling was the one-story hipped-roof dwelling. Nearly all of the one-story gable-front dwelling types found in the subdivision rest on raised basements. Examples of the gable-front form from this period include 1003 60th Avenue and 702-706 60th Place.

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More unusual and architecturally notable dwellings that date to this period include the Craftsman-style two-story cross-gable dwelling at 811 58th Avenue (ca. 1920), which features wooden brackets at the overhanging eaves and asphalt siding imitating the appearance of stone at the first story. The Louis Brown House at 701 Eastern Avenue (PG: 72-~~009~~-28, ca. 1930) includes a combination of decorative details typical of the Craftsman and Colonial Revival styles commonly found in catalogs of the period and features asphalt siding imitating bricks and a rusticated concrete block foundation.

The use of concrete blocks in foundations and front porches, somewhat common in the previous era, became more widespread during this period. These blocks are often rockfaced to simulate the solidity of stone. In the following period, concrete blocks executed in geometric shapes became common. The use of these materials allowed individuals to adorn and decorate their homes in a low-cost manner.

Residential Development, 1945 to 1960

Approximately twenty percent of the contributing buildings within the historic district postdate World War II. Common dwelling types from this period include the one- and one-and-one-half-story gable-front and one- and one-and-one-half-story side-gable dwellings. Examples of the side-gable dwellings from this era typically feature Colonial Revival detailing, including the dwellings located at 6109 Foote Street and 723 59th Place. Although frame construction continued to be used, the majority of the dwellings from this era are masonry. A few ranch houses were constructed during this period, although they are often oriented so that the side gable faced the side of the lot rather than the street. Common exterior wall cladding includes vinyl, aluminum, brick, and stucco.

Residential Development, Post 1960

Nearly forty percent of the dwellings within the historic district postdate 1960. These dwellings are scattered throughout the historic district, with the greatest concentrations between 61st Avenue and Balsamtree Drive in the Sylvan Vista subdivision and 56th Avenue and 57th Place in the North Fairmount Heights subdivision. The ranch, split-level and two-story dwelling are the most common post-1960 dwelling types and are typically constructed of frame and clad in brick and imitation wood siding. The majority of post-1960 residential development occupies historically vacant parcels. A portion of the North Fairmount Heights subdivision along Kolb and K streets between 56th Avenue and Sheriff Road is excluded from this historic district; although it was laid out, the streets were not opened and it was not built upon until the mid 1980s. Some dwellings and commercial properties from earlier eras were removed from the landscape to accommodate houses of this period as well.

Community Institutions

Community landmarks located within and along the edges of the historic district dating to the period of significance (1900-1960) include the Fairmount Heights Elementary School (1912) at 737 61st Avenue, the World War II Memorial (1946) at 701 59th Avenue, five churches (1022 59th Avenue, 716 59th Avenue, 708 60th

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Avenue, 1101 60th Avenue, and 726 60th Place), and a community hall (1908) at 715 61st Avenue. The school has been converted to use as a church but overall it retains its historic form, including the bell tower. The metal plaques attached to the 1946 World War II monument (PG: 72-~~009~~-29) are missing; however, the monument retains its historic setting and appearance. The most notable churches are associated with the earliest and largest congregations. The Grace Methodist Church (PG: 72-~~009~~-25) was constructed in 1911 and rebuilt in 1950 and features a corner entry tower, Gothic windows, and stucco-clad walls. The Sylvan Vista Baptist Church (PG: 72-~~009~~-40) was erected in 1954 of brick and features a notable corner tower. The community hall, known as Charity Hall (PG: 72-~~009~~-38), has undergone numerous changes since its date of construction in 1908, including reconstruction after a fire and extensive additions for conversion to a dwelling. Although it is highly altered, the central portion of the building retains its gable-front form and the structure remains an important visual landmark to the citizens of the community.

Commercial Enterprises

About half of the buildings that provided early commercial services to the suburban community are extant, including two buildings along 61st Avenue near Addison Road that are now used as dwellings (numbers 714 and 727) and commercial enterprises at 515 Eastern Avenue and 5906 Addison Road. The former filling station at 5301 Sheriff Road no longer retains sufficient integrity to convey its historic use as it has been converted to a retail store. The majority of commercial enterprises located within the historic district are modern buildings located in the vicinity of Eastern Avenue and Addison Road.

Landscape Features

Landscaping within the historic district is largely informal with some deliberate design treatments in the immediate vicinity of dwellings. Landscaping generally consists of modest foundation plantings along the front and side of dwellings with occasional specimen plantings in yards. Some streets, such as J Street west of 5th Place, are tree-lined; most streets have deciduous and coniferous trees randomly scattered in front and rear yards. In Sylvan Vista, the circle appears to contain ornamental plantings and the green space that divides 61st Avenue has some deciduous trees. Street curbs are concrete and sidewalks line most streets. Driveways are generally concrete, gravel, and dirt. Many of the yards are defined by chain link and wood board fencing; hedgerows and brick and concrete walls are less widespread. For those dwellings built into the hillside, such as those along the north side of Foote Street, concrete retaining walls and stairs leading up from the street are common landscape features.

Contributing and Non-Contributing Resources

The pre-1960 dwellings in the historic district contribute to the character of the community, excluding ten dwellings that are no longer identifiable as fifty years of age or older due to changes to form and massing and two dwellings that are in a state of ruin. Several historic community landmark buildings and structures, including five churches, an elementary school, a community hall, a World War II monument, and six commercial buildings are also contributing properties. The green space that separates 61st Avenue and the

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traffic circle in Sylvan Heights are also contributing features, although they are not included in the property count.

Most of the non-contributing properties within the historic district are parcels with single-family houses built after the historic district's period of significance (1900-1960). Much of the new construction is consistent with the scale of the historic houses; the exceptions are more recent larger dwellings. The park at 56th and Eastern avenues is not historic and is not considered contributing. DC Boundary Marker NE #9 at the intersection of Eastern Avenue and Sheriff Roads does not contribute to the significance of the historic district.

A number of historically vacant lots are scattered throughout the historic district. While originally intended as house lots, many of these lots appear to have been left vacant from the outset. Relatively few contained buildings that have since been removed; in most cases, where buildings have been removed, a new dwelling has been erected. The lots lacking a dwelling have not been classified as either contributing or non-contributing to the historic district.

Alterations

The historic district includes six separate subdivisions laid out over a twenty-three year period, with a fairly unified design. The overall plan for the development remains evident; the roadways, sidewalks, and layout of the lots remain largely intact from the original subdivisions. Modern infill is intermittent, and the buildings maintain their original uses. Generally, the original form, massing, and scale of the dwellings remain intact. The majority of the dwellings have modern windows, siding, and roof materials. Almost all of the dwellings retain the original brick veneer. In efforts to create more living space, many of the dwellings feature enclosed porches at the façade or additions. Given the size and shape of the lots, additions are typically to the rear elevation, although there are some instances of large additions to the façade and side elevations. The majority of dwellings continue to portray the appearance of early to mid-twentieth-century residences with random to uniform setbacks.

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Historical Narrative

Fairmount Heights is among the earliest planned communities for African Americans in the Washington, D.C., area. The community was formed from six subdivisions that were platted between 1900 and 1923. The earliest residents were African-American families seeking affordable, low cost, single-family houses in a suburban setting, where they could live independently and govern themselves. By 1901, the residents of Fairmount Heights had established the first of several citizens associations. Successful endeavors of the citizens associations included the erection of a town hall in 1908, the construction of the first African-American public elementary school in Prince George's County in 1912, and the formation of a town fire company in 1917. While the first attempt at incorporation of the six associated subdivisions into a town occurred in 1922, it was not until 1935 that the process was completed, and Fairmount Heights became the largest black municipality in Prince George's County. Fairmount Heights was also the home of several notable African Americans who made significant political contributions to the town and Prince George's County. The town was a center of political activism and progressivism throughout the early twentieth century, with regular features in local African-American newspapers. The extant residential buildings and community institutions reflect the continued growth of the community through the mid-twentieth century. To the present, Fairmount Heights is a thriving residential community.

History

Fairmount Heights: A Streetcar Suburb for African Americans, 1900-1930s

The beginnings and development of the community of Fairmount Heights is intertwined with the history of discrimination and segregation of African Americans in nineteenth- and twentieth-century America. Following the conclusion of the Civil War and the emancipation from slavery, there was a tremendous influx of African Americans to Washington, D.C., from the South. Many of these individuals were seeking jobs and cultural opportunities. At the time, the federal government was one of the few employers who provided African Americans the chance at professional, secure positions with the opportunity for advancement. The rapid expansion of the role of the federal government after the Civil War made a significant contribution to the growth of the African-American middle class in the District. By the early twentieth-century, the population of the District faced chronic housing shortages, overcrowding, and poor conditions in the residential areas of the city in part due to the influx of African Americans.⁶

In the mid-nineteenth century, the geography of the urban social and racial classes was heavily influenced by transportation; the lower classes typically resided downtown while the upper classes commuted from the railroad suburbs. The suburbs were an escape from the city, allowing for larger houses and lots in a semi-rural environment within close proximity to services, employment, and cultural activities. The introduction of the streetcar in the 1890s led to a boom in suburban expansion that radiated along linear corridors from the city center. Due to the lower fares of the streetcar and the greater accessibility and affordability of land and homes

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on the suburban periphery, the streetcar suburbs influenced a wider range of socio-economic groups. Typically, developers platted subdivisions on small lots within walking distance of streetcar stops.⁷ Even with developments in transportation and the movement of the local population outside of the city limits, it was difficult for African Americans to find alternative housing as ownership in many of the new subdivisions was restricted by race and often was based on covenants in deeds and minimum cost requirements for houses.⁸

While the suburbs formed during the streetcar era continued to be largely all-white neighborhoods, Fairmount Heights was one of the first twentieth-century subdivisions planned for African Americans working in Washington, D.C.⁹ The early growth of the Fairmount Heights community can be attributed to its proximity to and accessibility of the District of Columbia by streetcar. Although streetcar lines were present within Washington by the 1860s, streetcar service in Prince George's County did not arrive until the 1890s. In 1898, the East Washington Railroad, known as the Chesapeake Beach Railroad, was extended from the District line at Seat Pleasant to the Chesapeake Bay to serve vacationers. When streetcar service was expanded to throughout the winter months, suburbs grew up along the line. The line, which stopped at Gregory Station in Seat Pleasant (south of Fairmount Heights), became part of the Washington, Baltimore and Annapolis Railway in 1908.¹⁰

Another streetcar line traveled along present-day Kenilworth Avenue to the county border to the community of Beaver Heights (north of Fairmount Heights). Both stations were available to occupants of Fairmount Heights from the early twentieth century and into the 1930s.¹¹

Fairmount Heights Subdivisions, 1900-1923

An examination of G. M. Hopkins 1894 map of the area surrounding Washington, D.C., shows the vicinity of what would become Fairmount Heights occupied by a number of farms located along Addison Road (formerly Addison Chapel Road).¹² Sheriff Road was an east-west route that served as a connection with the old port road between Bladensburg and Upper Marlboro.¹³ Eastern Avenue (formerly District Boulevard) formed the boundary between Washington, D.C., and Prince George's County, Maryland. Surnames of property owners in

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proximity of the present-day community shown on the 1894 map include Godfrey, Silence, Wilson, Brown, and Hoover.¹⁴

In the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries, land speculators who anticipated the coming of streetcars through the area purchased most of the farms. Family heirs also subdivided a few of the rural enclaves that were to become the community of Fairmount Heights. In 1900, Edward L. Latimer surveyed the first development for Robinson White and Allen C. Clark, both white men. White and Clark had purchased portions of farms from the Wilson, Godfrey, Belt and Lee families with the intention of creating a suburb for African Americans. Robinson White was a lawyer and developer who lived in the District. Allen C. Clark was a lawyer and manager at the Equitable Life Insurance Company of Washington, D.C. In particular, Clark's upbringing and family connections made him sympathetic to the housing plights of African Americans in the early twentieth century.¹⁵

The first subdivision, filed on August 2, 1900, measured approximately fifty acres and included fifteen blocks along streets that ran perpendicular to Eastern Avenue and Addison Road. Two of the streets laid out in the development were named for the developers. (Today, Clark Street is 60th Avenue and White Street is 58th Avenue.)¹⁶

In addition to accessibility to the streetcar, the success of the subdivision was based in its ability to make home ownership affordable and adaptable to a variety of income levels. This was done by offering deep and narrow lots, generally measuring 25 by 125 feet in size. The small size of the standard lot allowed for combining in order to yield larger house sites, which provided for greater yard space and room for small livestock, such as chickens. Little capital was invested in the development, allowing the developers to sell the lots for modest down payments and low monthly fees.¹⁷ Initially, the streets were primarily dirt paths, and water and electricity were not available.¹⁸ In addition, the terrain was somewhat marshy in the lower levels of the subdivision, which encouraged mosquitoes.¹⁹

In May of 1900, ads for the sale of lots in Fairmount Heights were placed in the Washington editions of *The Times* and *The Evening Times*. Identified advantages of the suburb included elevation, a commanding view of the city, healthfulness, natural beauty, quality water, accessibility to the city, and cheapness of transportation. The location of the subdivision was advertised at the end of the electric railroad at Chesapeake Junction. Lots

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were priced between \$50 and \$175 and were available for a small cash payment, with terms for the balance. For those purchasers who built a home, a free lot was made available. There was also an option for the buyers to have the Fairmount Heights Land and Development Company build them a home for a small monthly payment. R. White was listed as the owner of the development company and J. R. Mansfield as the manager.²⁰

Given the success of the 1900 subdivision, seven years later, J. D. O'Meara subdivided an approximately twelve-acre tract of adjacent land that he acquired from Mosby Brown and his wife in 1899. The subdivision, known as Waterford, was located on the east side of Addison Road. The Waterford development was slow to sell; in 2010, only two of the dwellings extant within this portion of the subdivision pre-date 1930: the cross gable dwellings at 5502 and 5504 Addison Road.²¹

Between 1909 and 1911, three more adjacent subdivisions were filed south of Addison Road and within the present-day municipal boundary of Fairmount Heights. In 1909, Mount Weissner was platted on approximately 6.5 acres located west of the original subdivision for the heirs of John C. Weissner. The lots in this planned development were slightly larger, measuring fifty-feet wide.²² In 1910, North Fairmount Heights was platted on approximately fifteen acres for Elizabeth Haines, who acquired land from the John H. Wilson farm at an earlier date. This subdivision was located north of H Street (formerly Wilson Street) between 59th Avenue (formerly Fairmount Avenue) and Addison Road. The fourth subdivision, known as West Fairmount Heights, or Bryn Mawr, was composed of approximately thirty-six acres platted for John T. and Caroline A. Silence's heirs in 1911. The fourteen blocks were located west of the original subdivision and on the north side of Eastern Avenue surrounding the Silence family homestead.²³ Except for those parcels fronting Eastern Avenue, West Fairmount Heights was slow to develop, and the majority of the subdivision was vacant until the land was redeveloped by the Town of Fairmount Heights in 1985.²⁴

After World War I, the Weeks Realty Corporation of Delaware purchased the farm of Samuel Hoover, planning growth for the community of Fairmount Heights on thirty-five acres on the opposite side of Addison Road. In 1923, a subdivision called Sylvan Vista was platted on the land. The subdivision extended east to Balsamtree Drive (formerly 63rd Street) and north to Sheriff Road, forming the current municipal boundaries for the Town of Fairmount Heights. Typical of the earlier portions of Fairmount Heights, the lots generally measured 25 by 125 feet in size. However, this subdivision was different in that it was oriented around a market circle from which some of the streets radiated. Sylvan Vista also included planned green space along a tributary of the Beaver Dam Branch that flowed through the subdivision. The green space was located between one-way streets labeled Park Place (present-day 61st Avenue). The streets of the subdivision had names different from those subdivisions on the opposite side of Addison Road until road names were standardized in the Washington

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suburbs after World War II.²⁵ The ground in the new subdivision was at a lower level and as a consequence tended to be wet and swampy, prompting the residents of Fairmount Heights to refer to the residents of Sylvan Vista as living “down in the bottom.”²⁶

Early Residential Development in Fairmount Heights, 1900-1920

Typical of other African-American communities of the early twentieth century, residential development in Fairmount Heights occurred slowly and was scattered. Lots were sold and dwellings were erected as the financial means of the owners allowed. One notable exception to this pattern is a grouping of nineteen houses constructed along 62nd Avenue in the 1920s by developer Robinson White, known as Bungalow Row (PG: 72-~~009~~-41). White sold ten of the dwellings in the 1920s and rented the rest until his death in 1939. In 2010, ten of the original bungalows remain.²⁷

Many of the first occupants of Fairmount Heights were African Americans who worked for government agencies. For example, William B. Coles, occupant of 730 60th Avenue, worked as a clerk in the U.S. Department of the Treasury.²⁸ Residents Alice R. Dorsey and Samuel Towles were employed as messengers for the Treasury Department.²⁹ Henry Pinckney, occupant of 608 60th Place, was employed as a steward to President Theodore Roosevelt.³⁰ Robert S. Nichols of 802 58th Avenue was employed by the U.S. Pension Office.³¹ In 1910, in addition to government clerks, members of the Fairmount Heights community included businessmen, an architect, laborers, teachers, Pullman porters, bookkeepers, and a detective.³² A 1908 article in the *Washington Bee* stated, “most of the residents of Fairmount Heights are employees and business men of some sort in the city of Washington, and it is easy to see from the appearance of their beautiful homes just the class of people they are.”³³

Settlement in the neighborhood appears to have been greatly influenced by affiliations, such as kinship, professional relationships, and school networks. For example, John S. Johnson, occupant of 612 60th Avenue, was one of a number of residents who worked as Pullman porters.³⁴ Several of the early residents in the subdivision had common surnames, such as Brown and Coles. Indicative of longstanding school networks,

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graduates of Tuskegee Institute in Alabama and Howard University in Washington, D.C., settled in the subdivision. James F. Armstrong was a graduate of both institutions. He purchased three lots along 59th Avenue in 1904 and subsequently erected a cross-gable dwelling with notable architectural detailing.³⁵ William Sidney Pittman, occupant of 505 Eastern Avenue, was also a graduate of Tuskegee and Drexel University in Philadelphia.³⁶

The earliest dwellings were modest in size, form, and architectural detailing and many do not remain. Based on a 1990s examination of the architecture of the neighborhood that included a study of tax assessment information, it appears that several of the earliest owners purchased lots and constructed temporary dwellings or rented properties until time or money would allow for the construction of larger and more permanent shelters. For example, in 1912 the prominent brick dwelling of Samuel and Margaret Hargrove at 5907 K Street replaced a much smaller house that had occupied the property.³⁷ In addition, John S. Johnson, a Pullman porter, rented a dwelling three blocks to the north until his house at 612 60th Place (PG: 72-~~009~~-32) was completed in 1911.³⁸

Facing economic constraints, many of those individuals who purchased lots in the subdivision constructed their own dwellings or relied on the help of friends or family. Samuel Hargrove, a brick mason, and his wife Margaret, constructed a two-story brick dwelling on four lots in 1912. The notable dwelling features unusual molded brickwork and is believed to have been built by Hargrove.³⁹ Louis Brown was a carpenter who constructed several dwellings in the community, including the house of James A. Campbell in 1921 (PG: 72-~~009~~-37) and his own at 701 58th Avenue in 1930 (PG: 72-~~009~~-28). His dwelling, which replaced an earlier and smaller house constructed by his parents, features decorative detailing from popular house catalogs of the period.⁴⁰ Carpenter Samuel Fowler purchased lots in the subdivision ca. 1905 and constructed a two-story detached rowhouse with centered cross gable at 5603 Addison Road in 1900 (PG: 72-~~009~~-48).⁴¹

When economically feasible, residents updated dwellings or built new houses. Robert S. Nichols erected a dwelling at 802 58th Avenue in 1908; six years later, he had a central heating system installed in his house. William Coles had a similar system installed the same year.⁴² James A. Campbell first erected a house along Clark Avenue in 1908. Thirteen years later, he constructed a dwelling along 61st Street, two blocks to the south.⁴³ Houses were sometimes jacked up and placed on new basements, and bathrooms were added as water and sewer became available.

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Mass-marketed twentieth-century advances in building technology were adaptable to do-it-yourself construction and are found within the subdivision in the form of catalog houses and self-made concrete blocks. Ready-to-assemble houses sold through mail order by Sears Roebuck & Company enabled new homeowners to erect their dwellings, often with the help of friends, relatives, and neighbors. Shipped via the nearby railroad, the house kits included all of the materials needed to build a house. Examples include Bungalow Row (PG: 72-~~009~~-41), a group of ten dwellings along 62nd Avenue resembling the Sears Rosita model, and the Prince Albert Washington House at 949 Eastern Avenue (PG: 72-~~009~~-43), which resembles the Westly model offered by Sears in the 1920s.⁴⁴ There are other examples of housing similar in appearance to the Sears Rosita model throughout the early subdivision. In addition, three one-story dwellings with clipped gables along the west side of 60th Place may be catalog houses of unknown attribution. The early twentieth-century development of machines for the self-production of concrete blocks was undoubtedly utilized in the do-it-yourself construction efforts of community residents. Rusticated concrete blocks and other molded block forms are present in foundations and front porches of dwellings throughout the historic district.

Prominent Residents of Fairmount Heights

Given the progressive nature of the Fairmount Heights Historic District, it is expected that the people who were drawn to the community were socially prominent and politically active within Washington, D.C., and Prince George's County. These individuals had a strong sense of civic responsibility. Consequently, they were part of a cooperative network that developed early on and was successful in providing needed services to the community. It was the efforts of these citizens that helped form a municipal framework for the town of Fairmount Heights long before its incorporation in 1935.

James F. Armstrong was a graduate of Tuskegee Institute and the Howard University Law School, from which he graduated in 1904. He purchased three lots along 59th Avenue in 1905, and had a cross-gable dwelling with Folk Victorian detailing erected. Armstrong served as a member of the committee responsible for the construction of the Fairmount Heights Elementary School. As a graduate of Tuskegee Institute, whose foundations were based in industrial education, he was instrumental in providing the first public school industrial instruction (an alternative means for learning skills normally acquired through apprenticeship) for African Americans at the school in Fairmount Heights. He also served as the Superintendent of Colored Schools in Prince George's County, although controversy surrounded his tenure. After the incorporation of the town in 1935, he was one of the first council members.⁴⁵

In 1921, James A. Campbell hired local carpenter Louis Brown to erect a bungalow on a rise overlooking 61st Avenue.⁴⁶ Campbell, who worked as a messenger in the Government Printing Office, later opened his own

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print shop at the lower level of the frame bungalow dwelling. When the public school opened in Fairmount Heights, Mr. Campbell served as the instructor for the Industrial Department. At the time, this was the only public school offering industrial training for African Americans in Prince George's County. Campbell also served as the first treasurer for the town upon its incorporation in 1935, and mayor from 1943 to 1955.⁴⁷

Fairmount Height's most noted couple, William Sidney and Portia Pittman, moved to a dwelling they had erected on four lots overlooking Eastern Avenue (PG: 72-~~009~~-18) shortly after they were married in 1907. They resided in the historic district until 1912. Pittman attended Tuskegee Institute and received a degree in Architectural and Mechanical Drawing from Drexel Institute in Philadelphia. After graduation from Drexel, he returned as a teacher to Tuskegee University, where he met his future wife, Portia, daughter of Booker T. Washington, the university's founder. In 1905, he moved to Washington, D.C., and opened his own architectural office. Pittman was a noted African-American architect who is most famous for his design of the Negro Building at the National Tercentennial Exposition in Jamestown, Virginia. More importantly, Pittman played a critical role in the development of Fairmount Heights. Pittman organized the community's first civic association, the Fairmount Heights Mutual Improvement Association in 1908, and was instrumental in the construction of an elementary school for the town in 1912, serving as an advocate for approval of funding as well as the architect of the building.⁴⁸

The Robert S. Nichols House at 802 58th Avenue (PG: 72-~~009~~-39) was built in 1908. Nichols, who worked in the District of Columbia at the U.S. Pension Office, came from Texas to Fairmount Heights in 1909. He was part of the citizens committee that moved for the establishment of a public elementary school in Fairmount Heights. Nichols also helped lead the effort for incorporation of the town in 1935. The same year he was elected as the town's first mayor, a position he served for two consecutive terms.⁴⁹

In 1912, the *Washington Bee* reported: "Mr. C. H. Fonville has let the contract for the erection and completion of his residence, which will be a fine eight room dwelling with cellar, furnace and all modern improvements. . . Fairmount Heights is on a boom."⁵⁰ Cornelius Fonville erected a Foursquare dwelling at 602 60th Place (PG: 72-~~009~~-35). He was a messenger for the Bureau of Engraving. Fonville was a prominent local citizen, who was active in the civic associations of Fairmount Heights. Fonville also led the movement for the town's incorporation during the 1920s, with his efforts finally realized in 1935.⁵¹

Doswell E. Brooks constructed a dwelling at 6107 Foot Avenue in 1928. He served as the Supervisor of Colored Schools for Prince George's County and led the movement for the establishment of African-American high schools in Prince George's County. In 1956, Brooks assumed a position as the first African-American

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member of the county's Board of Education. Brooks also served in local government as a member of the Fairmount Heights town council and as mayor from 1955 until 1965. During his time as mayor, the town garnered funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development for street and sidewalk improvements.⁵²

In 1920, John and Martha Trammell erected a Colonial Revival side-gable dwelling with prominent modillions at the cornice line at 717 59th Avenue (PG: 72-~~009~~-26). In 1937, the dwelling became the home and law office of James H. Taylor. Taylor, a graduate of Howard University, served as Assistant State's Attorney, Prince George's County, 1963-1966, and Master for Juvenile Causes, 1966-1968. Taylor was appointed as Prince George's County's first African-American judge in 1969. He held a position on the Court of the Seventh Judicial Circuit Court from 1969 until 1988.⁵³

Robert Ridley Gray was the first principal at the Fairmount Heights school that opened in 1934, a position he held for thirty-three years. Gray also served as president of the Fairmount Heights Credit Union and mayor from 1977 to 1989.⁵⁴ The gable-front dwelling located at 5502 Addison Road served as his home.

Educational Institutions in Fairmount Heights

Soon after residents began moving into the community in the early 1900s, the need for a local elementary school became apparent. In 1909, Carrie Griffin began teaching students in a dwelling on 59th Avenue. By 1910, there were one-hundred children in the community attending school in the community hall, and James F. Armstrong and Robert S. Nichols began to lobby to the Board of School Commissioners for a public school. In 1911, the board agreed to construction and awarded the design to architect William Sidney Pittman, a resident of the community. A committee to oversee construction was formed and included Pittman, Nichols, Armstrong, Walter Grouse, and Frank Coalman. Notably, this was the first public elementary school to be erected in a planned African-American suburb of Washington, D.C.⁵⁵

The Fairmount Heights Elementary School was constructed in 1912 on four lots at the corner of 61st Avenue (formerly Chapel Avenue) and Addison Road. School was held in the first story until the second story was finished in 1913. A 1915 article in the *Washington Bee* reported the notably large school contained four classrooms, three hallways, and a carpenter shop. Enrollment, which numbered seventeen pupils at the time of the school's opening, had increased to 160 pupils who were instructed by five teachers. The school was the first public school in the county to offer industrial training to African-Americans, with James Armstrong serving as

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the Director of Manual Training for the school and James Campbell as instructor for the Industrial Department.⁵⁶

By 1922, the school was overcrowded, prompting James Armstrong to appear before the Board of School Commissioners to request funds for the construction of an addition to the rear of the building, which was erected shortly thereafter. A 1923 report noted that classes at the school remained crowded and gave reason for need of a new facility to house the high-school age:

... we believe that larger grounds ought to be secured and that the people of this, the largest community of Colored people in the county, should drive for a six or eight-room fireproof building."⁵⁷

After citizens requested the construction of a high school within the community in 1926, the Board agreed to approve the proposal under the condition that the community would donate five acres of land to the school system. Concurrently, other African-American communities seeking schools in their own communities submitted proposals for the construction of schools in Lakeland, Lincoln, and nearby Cedar Heights, located on the opposite side of Addison Road. A decision on the controversial issue was not made until March of 1931, when the Board of Education requested \$35,000 for the construction of a school at Fairmount Heights.

The school at Addison Road was removed from service and subsequently purchased by the Mount Zion Apostolic Faith Church, who altered the building for use as a church. The majority of changes necessary for the conversion were confined to the interior of the building. Exterior changes included enclosure of the bell tower and alterations to the façade (west elevation) to accommodate an entrance to the sanctuary.⁵⁸

In 1934, a new eight-room brick school was erected on more than four acres at the corner of Addison and Sheriff roads (just north of the historic district).⁵⁹ After the school closed in 1973, the children of Fairmount Heights were bused to six different communities. The school was demolished in 1978, and a neighborhood park occupies the parcel today.⁶⁰

Fairmount Heights High School opened in 1950 (outside of the town limits in nearby Chapel Oaks) and included the first twelfth-grade class in the county; previously African-American students had only attended eleven grades. The high school served the African-Americans of western Prince George's County and was one of two

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African-American high schools. Despite efforts to close the school following desegregation in 1972, due to local public outcry and support, it remained open and continues to serve the citizens of Fairmount Heights.⁶¹

Civic Institutions in Fairmount Heights

As municipal self-government was not available to African Americans in the early twentieth century, civic associations played an important role in the community by enabling the townspeople to assume these functions through organized structures. These organizations often held fundraisers and provided money needed for capital improvements. In Fairmount Heights, the efforts of community associations were very effective, resulting in the construction of a social hall, erection of Prince George's County's first African-American public elementary school, and the creation of a volunteer fire department. A 1909 article from the Washington Bee discussing the activists in the community stated: "these men are all banded together in a strong determination to develop Fairmount Heights into one of the strongest colored settlements in the entire country."⁶²

In 1901, William Sidney Pitman helped to organize and served as the President of the Fairmount Heights Mutual Improvement Company with the purpose "to develop Fairmount Heights as a viable alternative to inner city ghetto living." The incorporation papers filed seven years later, in 1908, indicate that the primary purpose of the Company was "to purchase lots and erect thereon in Fairmount Heights, Maryland, a building to be used as a public hall for religious, charitable and other similar purposes."⁶³ The Improvement Company raised enough funds and support to purchase two lots on 61st Avenue and fund the construction of a hall the same year. The building served as a meeting place for the Republican Club, as a church, and as the location of social and charitable functions. Classrooms for the community were also housed in the hall until a public school was erected in 1912. After the dissolution of the Company in 1924, the property was purchased by Malkiah Charity, one of the original directors. The building, which assumed the name Charity Hall, continued to be used as a gathering place and site of social events. Although the building was rebuilt after a fire and extensively enlarged when it was converted to use as a dwelling, it remains a landmark within the community.⁶⁴

There were other notable civic associations in Fairmount Height's early history. Charles E. Payne formed the Progressive Citizens' Association in 1911. The Mutual Improvement Company and the Progressive Citizens' Association combined in 1912 to form the United Citizens' Association of Fairmount Heights.⁶⁵ Also during this period, the women of Fairmount Heights formed the Ladies Improvement Club to raise money for the laying of gravel sidewalks and erection of street lights along the main streets. Between 1909 and 1910, seventeen

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street lights and several new sidewalks were added.⁶⁶ A citizen's association under the direction of Chair D. N. Brown constructed a wooden sidewalk that led from the community toward the streetcar railroad and installed kerosene street lights purchased from the District Columbia.⁶⁷ Robert S. Nichols headed a citizen's committee who purchased land for and brought about the establishment of a public school in Fairmount Heights in 1912.⁶⁸ In 1917, thanks to the efforts of a citizen's association, a volunteer fire company was formed, and the first chemical fire truck was purchased. A firehouse to house the fire truck was constructed shortly thereafter on land donated by C. Marshall.⁶⁹

Despite the organized efforts of local residents, internal improvements within the community were slow to occur due to a lack of funding. For example, by 1934, only Addison Road and Eastern Avenue were paved. Driven by a need to improve the streets and bring water and electricity to the area, a move for incorporation of the town began in the 1920s, spearheaded by Cornelius Fonville.⁷⁰ It took thirteen years before the Town of Fairmount Heights was formed.⁷¹

As outlined in the town's charter, the corporate limits of the town included the Fairmount Heights (1909), North Fairmount Heights (1910), West Fairmount Heights (1911), Waterford (1907), Sylvan Vista (1935) and a portion of Mount Weissner (1909) subdivisions and encompassed nearly 150 acres. The town was to be led by a mayor and council of six residents, which represented each of the six wards established under the town's charter. The treasurer was to be appointed by the mayor and council. The first elected officials of the town included Robert S. Nichols, Mayor, and council members: Ernest Kirkland, Jane Atwoode, Sadie Q. Charity, A. J. Harrison and James F. Armstrong. James A. Campbell served as treasurer.⁷²

Under the jurisdiction of Mayor Nichols, who served two terms, electric lighting was installed in 1937, and a volunteer police department was established. In 1937, the town purchased equipment to improve the dirt streets, which were graded and graveled under the direction of the street and light committee and the Maryland State Roads' Commission.⁷³

In 1941, the crossing of a stream at the northwestern end of the town (likely Sheriff Road over a branch of Beaver Creek) posed a problem for motorists traveling to and from Fairmount Heights. Consequently, the town engineer, Jefferson D. Johnson, designed a bridge, purchased materials with his own money, and paid for and supervised its construction. The town budget would not allow for the hard surfacing of roadways, so the

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residents formed neighborhood groups responsible for maintenance of certain areas of the community.⁷⁴ In 1944, the first street curbs were installed. Also by this time, the street names were changed to follow the system of street naming implemented throughout the Washington suburbs.⁷⁵

Between 1939 and 1941, the Town of Fairmount Heights purchased four lots on Addison Avenue (now 60th Place). By 1942, the citizens of the town erected a municipal building on the lot. The lower level served as the town fire hall, while the upper level was devoted to a meeting space. A two-story wing added to the south in 1946 provided more meeting space and room for a library. The library remained in this location until space on Addison Road was obtained in 1959. By the early 1950s, the fire department no longer occupied the building, and it was used to house the offices of the mayor, council, clerk, treasurer, health department and police department. The town's offices relocated to the building at 6100 Jost Street in Sylvan Vista in the 1990s. The original municipal hall was removed after 1996; all that occupies the parcel in 2010 is a post-1960 garage.⁷⁶

Despite segregation in the armed forces during World War II, the citizens of Fairmount Heights served their country. To commemorate the efforts of their citizens, a monument to the young men of Fairmount Heights who served in World War II was erected in a triangular lot at the corner of 59th Avenue and 59th Place (originally Fairmount and Belmont avenues). The effort was led by the Monument Memorial Committee. The location of the monument was originally the home of Reverend Joshua Barnes, who erected a dwelling on the site in 1909. The dwelling was no longer present at the time of construction of the monument in 1946. It likely the site was chosen for its prominent corner location. The monument and adjacent curvilinear brick wall announcing the Town of Fairmount Heights are similar in appearance to the contemporary Seat Pleasant World War II Monument. The monument originally featured metal plaques with the name of each soldier who served and died in the war; the plaques are missing in 2010.⁷⁷

Community Institutions in Fairmount Heights

In the African-American communities of the early twentieth century as well as into the present day, community places were not limited to schools and town halls. Fraternal halls and lodges, clubs, recreational facilities, and churches served as community meeting places and centers of cultural interaction and educational and political activity. Churches in particular often provided an opportunity for outsiders to address political and social issues,

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such as the Civil Rights movement.⁷⁸ Calvin Chase, the editor of the *Washington Bee*, and Professor Kelley Miller of Howard University were often speakers at local churches in Fairmount Heights.⁷⁹

By 1910, the *Washington Bee* reported that there were active Methodist, Presbyterian, and Baptist congregations within the community. The Fairmount Heights Grace Methodist Church was formed in 1909 and met in Charity Hall as well as citizen's homes until a small three-bay gable front church with Gothic windows and a small belfry at the ridge was erected between 1909 and 1911 at 716 59th Avenue. Around 1950, the church was enlarged and the exterior walls were covered in stucco, giving it its present-day appearance.⁸⁰ Based on the date stone, the First Baptist Church at 806 58th Avenue was organized in 1912, and the current building was erected in 1980.

The Sylvan Vista Baptist Church that occupies 1103 60th Avenue replaced earlier churches constructed on five lots in the Sylvan Vista subdivision of Fairmount Heights. The first pastor was Arthur Luckett, one of the early organizers of the congregation that formed shortly after 1923. The current building was erected by the community in 1954 using bricks salvaged from the demolition of houses in the District. The bricks were brought to the site by a local resident, cleaned by area youth, and laid by church members who had masonry experience. In 1968, an earlier stucco church was removed to make way for the construction of an education building to the rear.⁸¹

An examination of Sanborn Fire Insurance Maps reveals three additional churches were present with the community by 1959 at 1022 58th Avenue, 708 60th Avenue, and the former Fairmount Heights Elementary School at the corner of Addison Road and 61st Avenue. Today, the church at 1022 58th Avenue serves as the Agape Bible Church and the church at 708 60th Avenue serves the New Generation for Christ Fellowship Church congregation. The present-day church at 726 60th Place is shown as a dwelling in 1959. The Eastside Holy Trinity Church at 717 58th Avenue was organized in 1968.

In 1959, the town contained two lodges: a building in the location of the present day Independent Order of Odd Fellows (IOOF) along Addison Road and the W. Bruce Evans Lodge Hall located along 61st Avenue. Neither of these buildings remains today. These fraternal organizations provided African Americans with another way to work together to achieve common goals as well as a place to socialize and recreate in a segregated society.⁸² In addition to the local lodges, there was a club house located at 609 Jost Street that is no longer extant. Also, a

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dance pavilion is said to have occupied the former William Sidney Pittman property at 505 Eastern Avenue during the period in time in which it served as a boardinghouse.⁸³

Commercial Enterprises in Fairmount Heights

The community of Fairmount Heights was supported by a number of African-American businesses. In 1937, the town included six grocery stores, two second-hand clothing stores, three beauty stops, three tailoring establishments, three restaurants and beer gardens, one dance pavilion, one architect's office, two hauling businesses, and three real estate firms.⁸⁴ An examination of 1959 Sanborn Fire Insurance Maps and existing conditions reveals that only vestiges of the range of goods and services once provided to the community are visible today.

The historic concentration of commercial establishments was located along Addison Road and Eastern Avenue, the main thoroughfares through the town. The greatest number of extant commercial establishments is located at the northern end of 61st Avenue (formerly Chapel Avenue) near Addison Road. Historically this end of the block included two dry cleaners (one remains at number 727), a nursery school (no longer extant), a business in the basement of a dwelling (number 725), and two stores, one of which offered coal for sale (number 714 is extant). Today, all of the commercial properties at the northern end of 61st Avenue are under residential use. Most are residential forms with features typical of commercial use including plate-glass windows and separate entrances from residential spaces.

Stores also fronted on Addison Road or nearby side streets. A large commercial complex present at the northwest corner of Kolb Street and Addison Road in 1959 is now the location of the Fairmount Heights Public Library. While the former restaurant at 6102 Jefferson Heights Drive has been removed, a store to the north at 6106 remains, although it is no longer in use. An auto repair shop, now vacant, is extant at 6117 Jost Street in the Sylvan Vista portion of the town.

Commercial enterprises were also located along Eastern Avenue and north on the adjacent side streets. Only the former dry cleaner at the intersection of Eastern Avenue and 61st Avenue is extant and is now occupied by a liquor store. The former laundry at 617 61st Avenue, store to the south at 607 61st Avenue, and a restaurant on the opposite side of 61st Avenue at number 608 (present day 525) have all been removed. In addition, former stores at 803 and 730 59th Avenue are no longer extant and have been replaced by modern dwellings. The intersection of 57th Place and Eastern Avenue is occupied by a post-1960 commercial building that is now vacant. At the corner of Eastern Avenue and Sheriff Road is a former filling station that has lost all identifying features in its conversion to retail use.

Fairmount Heights, 1960-Present

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The community of Fairmount Heights has continued to be a home to African Americans of Prince George's County. In the late 1960s and early 1970s, a number of garden apartments and condominiums were constructed on the border between Prince George's County and Washington, D.C., resulting in an influx of African Americans from the city to the area.⁸⁵

With the increasing use of automobiles during this period, residents could work further from home, attend other schools, and shop and fulfill their religious and social needs elsewhere. A newspaper article prepared in 1985 at the fifty-year celebration of the town's incorporation noted that while the population of the community remained at nearly one hundred-percent African American, there was now only one grocery store, and public transportation was not nearly as widely utilized as in earlier decades.⁸⁶

While new construction in the historic district leveled off in the 1970s, efforts of the Town Council resulted in continued growth in the late twentieth century. For example, a portion of the Fairmount Heights West subdivision along K and Kolb streets was redeveloped in the mid-1980s when the town purchased the land from nine private owners to create twenty-nine townhouses for low-income single families.⁸⁷ In 2010, the Town of Fairmount Heights community remains a thriving suburb of Washington, D.C.

Statement of Significance

The Fairmount Heights Historic District is significant under Criterion A in the areas of community planning and development, ethnic heritage, and politics and government, as outlined in the *African-American Historic Resources of Prince George's County, Maryland Multiple Property Documentation Form*. Fairmount Heights is among the earliest planned communities for African Americans in the Washington, D.C., area. The layout, dwelling types and construction methods found in the community illustrate patterns typical of early twentieth-century African-American residential suburbs. Early endeavors of the town's citizens, including the erection of a town hall in 1908 and the construction of the first African-American public elementary school in Prince George's County in 1912, are illustrative of successful efforts at self-government in a community that allowed African-American citizens control over their lives. The town retains five churches, a community hall, and school that served as social and political centers for the area during segregation. The community was a center of political activism and progressivism throughout the early twentieth century, with regular features in local African-American newspapers. During this period, Fairmount Heights was also the home of several notable African-Americans who made significant political and social contributions to the town and Prince George's County. The extant residential buildings and community institutions reflect the continued growth of the community through the mid-twentieth century. To the present, Fairmount Heights is a thriving residential community.

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The period of significance begins in 1900, with the platting of the first subdivision known as Fairmount Heights, and ends in 1960. The town has remained a prominent African-American community in Prince George's county to the present day; therefore, the period of significance extends to the fifty-year age criteria consideration.

Integrity

The dwellings and support buildings that make up the Fairmount Heights Historic District retain sufficient integrity to convey their historic associations. As outlined under the *African-American Historic Resources of Prince George's County, Maryland Multiple Property Documentation Form*, those aspects of integrity that are most important for properties nominated under Criterion A for their association with African-American history include location, setting, design, feeling, and association.

For communities such as Fairmount Heights, integrity of location conveys the geographic restrictions that were placed on African Americans during segregation. Integrity of setting is evident in the relationship between the community of Fairmount Heights and its proximity to the District of Columbia and the greater transportation network. With regards to integrity of association and feeling, in African-American communities, institutional facilities, such as churches and schools, are often endowed with significant associative meaning by the citizenry.

Collectively, the historic district does not retain sufficient integrity of materials and workmanship to warrant consideration as a collection of resources that embody the distinctive characteristics of a type, period or method of construction. Over time, many of the distinguishing features of dwelling types and styles have been removed or concealed, thereby affecting integrity of materials and workmanship. The concealment or removal of distinguishing features is more important to those resources eligible as an example of a given style or period of architecture rather than for historic significance. For the purposes of retention of historic significance and integrity of design, it is more critical that buildings retain their historic form and massing and are visually recognizable for their historic function or use. For example, despite the application of siding to the Fairmount Heights Elementary School and other alterations made in its conversion to use as a church (enclosure of the belfry and changes to the principal entry), it is still recognizable as a school building. In addition, physical alterations do not lessen these historic associations or their meaning for the community. Thus, despite additions to the side and rear of Charity Hall, the former social hall is a contributing resource to the Fairmount Heights Historic District due to its strong integrity of association and feeling and retention of integrity of location and setting in a prominent location overlooking 61st Avenue.

Within the historic district, eleven buildings were identified that have undergone such significant alterations that they can no longer convey their historic form and massing. Typically, non-contributing dwellings constructed within the period of significance have been altered by significant additions to the façade which have affected integrity of design to such a degree that the buildings can no longer convey their historic appearance and associations.




Description of Property and Eligibility Determination: *(Use continuation sheet if necessary and attach map and photo)*

Fairmount Heights includes a large number of simple late 19th century houses. Most are small, two bay buildings with gables facing the street and extending back on their narrow, deep lots. The windows are generally 2/2 double hung sash with wide central muntins, moulded cornices are returned on the face of the buildings, and one-story porches extend across the facades. Some of the houses are double, and several of the buildings have heavier cornices with central gables and brackets. These are shed-roofed, with two-bay facades. California bungalows are interspersed among the houses. There is also a school building of 1920s "Progressive" design with a tower on the façade and large windows.



Fairmount Heights was established in the early 20th century as an African American suburb of Washington, D.C. The community illustrates the early migration of blacks to the suburbs within the same time-frame that whites were leaving the city for more bucolic suburbs. The architecture of Fairmount Heights is generally modest and reflects the socio-economic status of the African-American community in the early 20th century.



Fairmount Heights includes a large number of simple late nineteenth century houses. Most are small two-bay buildings with gables facing the street and extending back on their narrow, deep lots. The windows are generally wood 2/2 double-hung sash, molded cornices are returned on the face of the buildings, and one-story porches extend across the facades. Some of the buildings have shed roofs featuring heavier cornices, central dormers and decorative brackets. While most buildings are single-family residences, there are also a few duplexes within the neighborhood. In general, the residential buildings are modest wood-frame houses of irregular Four-square, cross-gable and front-gable plans of vernacular Victorian era houses. Others are two-story houses with shallow pitched shed roofs, and hipped bungalows. Some houses resemble the "Rosita" and "Westly" models by Sears, Roebuck and Company.

Many of the houses have been altered by the application of modern synthetic materials and vacant lots throughout the town have been filled with new residences. Despite these changes, the historic association of the town with late nineteenth century suburban development by the African American community remains evident. Elements that contribute to the significance of the neighborhood include the original grid pattern of streets, small community park and the numerous historic residences representing various periods of development.

Fairmount Heights is located in Prince George’s County, adjacent to the extreme east corner of the District of Columbia. Established in 1900, Fairmount Heights is one of the earliest planned communities for African-Americans in the Washington, D.C. area. The community consists of six planned subdivisions platted between 1900 and 1923. Robinson White and Allen Clark, white businessmen from the District of Columbia, platted the first subdivision in 1900 on 50 acres of farmland formerly owned by the Wilson, Godfrey, Belt, and Lee families. The subdivision called Fairmount Heights consisted of a grid-pattern of streets that extended to the northeast, away from the District boundary. The average lot size was 25 feet wide by 125 feet deep and was priced to encourage their purchase by African-Americans from the city.

In 1907, a second subdivision was platted by J.D. O’Meara on 12 acres called Waterford. This subdivision on the eastside of Fairmount Heights was slow to develop. John C. Wiessner had the third subdivision in the area platted in 1909. Named Mount Wiessner, the subdivision was laid out on 56 acres and had larger lots than the rest of Fairmount Heights. Only one acre from this subdivision was included in Fairmount Heights when the town was incorporated in 1935.

Elizabeth Haines added eight blocks to the Fairmount Heights subdivision in 1910 when the North Fairmount Heights subdivision was platted. This development was followed in 1911 by the Silence family subdivision, West Fairmount Heights. The heirs of the Silence family subdivided their 36-acre farm around their farmhouse.

The developers of the Fairmount Heights subdivisions laid out the streets and sold the lots, leaving the construction of houses to the lot owners. One exception was the construction of 19 small bungalows in 1920 by Robinson White, one of the original developers of the first Fairmount Heights subdivision. These bungalows were sold between 1920 and 1929.

The last subdivision in Fairmount Heights was begun in 1922. The Weeks Realty Company platted Sylvan Vista on the Hoover family farm. The subdivision differed from the rest of Fairmount Heights by arranging lots along streets radiating out from a central “market” circle. The developers also reserved parkland along a ravine in the middle of the community. The houses constructed in Sylvan Heights were smaller than the residences in the rest of the neighborhood.

When Fairmount Heights was incorporated in 1935, its corporate boundaries included the subdivisions of Fairmount Heights, North Fairmount Heights, West Fairmount Heights, Waterford, Sylvan Heights, and a part of Mount Wiessner. Though curbs were installed in 1944, more than two-thirds of the town’s roads remained unimproved for many years. This problem was not remedied until street and sidewalk paving began in 1967.

Throughout its history, Fairmount Heights has contained many community associations and community buildings. The Fairmount Heights Mutual Improvement Company constructed a social hall on Chapel Avenue (now 61st Street) in 1908 to serve community functions. The building also housed the community school and Methodist church until separate facilities were constructed. After many years, the building was converted to residential use. The first school was constructed in 1912 and was replaced in 1934. A fire

company was formed and a station built in 1917. A municipal center constructed in 1942 provided new facilities for the fire and police departments, as well as administrative office space. In 1980 a new multi-purpose structure was constructed for meeting space, administrative offices and the police department.

Verbal boundary description and justification

The National Register boundary delineated for the Fairmount Heights Historic District coincide with the boundaries recommended by the Historic Preservation Section of the Prince George's County Planning Department (M-NCPPC) in 1993. The boundary was drawn to include the largest area of residential buildings constructed within the period of significance (1900-circa 1950) and retaining a modest degree of integrity. Areas containing modern infill, redevelopment, vacant lots and unsympathetic alterations to historic buildings were excluded from the historic district. The boundary includes three of the original six subdivisions: Fairmount Heights, Mount Weissner and the southern half of North Fairmount Heights. In general, this area is bounded by Kolb Street on the north, Addison Road and 62nd on the east, Eastern Avenue on the south, and 58th Avenue on the west. The boundary includes tax parcels facing Kolb Street, Addison Road, 62nd Avenue, Eastern Avenue, 58th Avenue, 59th Avenue, 59th Place, 60th Place, 61st Avenue, Field Place, H Street, J Street and K Street.



The area includes a large number of simple late nineteenth century houses. Most are small, two bay buildings with gables facing the street and extending back on their narrow, deep lots. The windows are 2/2 double hung sash with wide central muntins. The moulded cornices are returned on the face of the building, one story porches extend across the facades. Some of the houses are double. Several buildings have heavier cornices with central gables and brackets. These are shed-roofed, with two bay facades. California bungalows are interspersed among the houses. There is also a school building of 1920's "Progressive" design with a tower on the facade and large windows.
