Description:

The Reilly house and store is a three-part H-shaped frame building, two stories high with metal roof, located on the south side of Old Marlboro Pike in Forestville. The west section (originally the dwelling) is ca. 15'x 26', and consists of two parlors, front and back, with a projecting shed-roofed bay in the gable end facing the street. The east section (originally the store) is ca. 21'x 26' and: has three bays in the gable end facing the street; a one-story porch with stick style brackets shelters the north gable end and wraps around the east side of this section. (The east section was significantly altered in the 1920's when it was converted from a store to a residence.) The east and west sections are connected by a central gable-roofed stair hall ca. 18' long, running at right angles to the east and west sections. This central section has three bays with entrance in the third bay, and is sheltered by a one-story porch with bracketed posts. The entire building is covered with brick-pattern asphalt shingle.

Significance:

There has been a store at this location since the Civil War period. In 1863 Susannah Reilly purchased a 2-acre lot on the south(west) side of the main road (Old Marlboro Pike) through Long Old Fields; by 1867 her husband, Edward Reilly, had completed the construction of a two-part building, the west section of which served as his home, and the east as his store. Reilly operated the store for ca. 30 years in the community which developed on the site of Long Old Fields and came to be known as Forestville. In 1896, the Reillys sold the residence and store building to George S. Dove, who operated a grocery store there until ca. 1915. His daughter married in 1921, and converted the east section from a store into a dwelling: the large store room was converted into two adjoining parlors, and a more formal entrance was built in the north gable end. Dove's will (1935) devised the entire building to his daughter, Alice Baker, and it remains in the family to the present time.

The Reilly house and store is a three-part, H-shaped frame building, two stories high with metal roof, located on the south side of Old Marlboro Pike in Forestville. It is located in what was the commercial center of post-bellum Forestville, where it served both as a general store and the storekeeper's dwelling; it faces approximately north on what is now a busy highway.

The west section of the building was originally the dwelling house. It is a two-and-one-half story building (ca. 15' x 26') with gable roof; in the north gable end which faces the street there is a projecting shed-roofed bay. The interior of this section consists of two parlors, front and back, with back-to-back fireplaces served by a central chimney at the ridge. The moldings in this section of the building are uniformly fairly simple, with bulls-eye corner blocks.

The west section of the building is connected to the east (store) section by a two-story gable-roofed stair-hall running at right angles to the east and west sections. The door and window architraves in this cross-hall have bulls-eye corner block moldings identical to those in the western section. The north front of this section (ca. 18') has three bays, the third being a door with one-light transom, the principal entrance to the dwelling house section. Across the north front of this central section is a one-story shed-roof porch with bracketed posts. This porch has been extended to the north, making it deeper than it was early in this century.¹

The eastern section of the building was originally the store. It is a two-story building with gable roof, ca. 21' x 26'. The roofline of this section differs from that of the western section in that it has a longer and shallower slope. This section originally consisted of one large store room with a smaller back room added to the south. The north gable end facing the street has three bays; in the central bay is a door with five-pane side-lights. A one-story porch with stick style brackets shelters the north gable end and wraps around the east side of this section. There is a chimney with corbelled cap at the south end of the original store-room.

There has been a store at this location since the Civil War period. In 1863 Susannah Reilly purchased a 2-acre lot on the south(west) side of the main road (Marlboro Pike) through Long Old Fields, where her husband, Edward Reilly, planned to operate a store. By 1867 Reilly had completed the construction of a two-part building, the west section of which served as his home, and the east as his store.¹ Reilly operated this store for ca. 30 years in the gradually expanding community which developed on the site of Long Old Fields and came to be known as Forestville.

In 1896, the Reillys sold their residence and store building, together with three adjoining acres to George S. Dove, who added two additional rooms (east and south) to the store section of the buildings, and continued to operate the store until approximately 1915.² Dove also farmed his adjoining property, and his merchandise consisted principally of farm produce and other groceries. The 1900 census indicates that Dove's family of nine, plus a farm laborer, lived in the attached dwelling house, and that his oldest son worked as a salesman in the grocery store.³

Dove's store was closed by 1915, and in 1921 when his daughter Alice married Albert Baker, the young couple converted the east section of the building (the former store room) into a residence. At this time, the Bakers converted the large store room into two adjoining parlors, and built a separate staircase into the southerly parlor; the north entrance to the store was replaced with a more formal side-lighted door. All of the interior molding in this east section was replaced, and the back room was converted into a kitchen. The east addition to the store room was removed and the north porch was extended to wrap around the east end of the building.⁴

In his will (1935), George Dove devised to his daughter Alice Baker the building in which she lived. It remains in the family to the present time.⁵


