Description

Kildare is a two-story brick gable roofed dwelling with a "T" shaped plan. The L-shaped main block has a two story brick east wing, completing the "T" shape. The house is located high on a hill overlooking the Rosecroft raceway, to its south. It is surrounded by rolling terrain that is fenced for horse pasture and is reached by a long, tree-lined gravel entry drive. The south main facade is sheltered by a two-story flat-roofed porch supported by Tuscan Doric columns. There are entry doors in the first and fifth bays, of six panels surmounted by a four-light transom. The doors flank three 9/6 double-hung sash windows with sills of brick headers. The arrangement of doors and windows on the second story is the same. Kildare is of whitepainted brick. The roofing is weathered asphalt shingle. The crown-molded cornice is returned in the gable ends. The narrow east wing is slightly lower in height than the main block, and is probably the earlier portion of the house. It is laid in common bond. The three bay south (main) elevation has 6/6 sash windows with Jack arch lintels on the first story. The land around the house slopes down on all sides. The entry drive branches off with a lane running south of the house, through a farm yard. The six frame agricultural outbuildings clustered around the farm lane are all in good repair, painted white with red metal roofs.

Significance

Kildare is significant as a plantation house with a long history, in the Oxon Hill District of the County. It is a large white-painted brick building standing high atop a hill, making it a local landmark. In the mid-twentieth century it was the home of the William Miller family, who developed and promoted Rosecroft Raceway, located just south of the house. Kildare was constructed in two sections. The original three story, three- by-two bay brick dwelling dates to the second quarter of the 19th century. A large ell-shaped west and north addition was constructed in the first decade of the twentieth century, more than doubling the size of the house. The early structure has been altered so that its original orientation is not apparent. In 1854 Dr. Peter Heiskell purchased 320 acres of Tolson's Purchase from George S. Tolson. The original block of the house was constructed by Tolson or by Heiskell shortly after he acquired the property. Dr. Peter Heiskell died in 1893, but the property continued in family ownership through 1945. After the death of Jesse L. Heiskell in 1942, Kildare was acquired by William E. Miller, founder of the William E. Miller Furniture Company. Miller established the Rosecroft Raceway south of the house, on part of the property, and resided at Kildare. After the death of Miller's widow in 1972 the property passed to Riggs National Bank as part of a Trust agreement.

Kildare is a two-story brick gable roofed dwelling with a "T" shaped plan. The L-shaped main block has a two story brick east wing, completing the "T" shape. The house is located high on a hill overlooking the Rosecroft raceway, to its south. It is surrounded by rolling terrain that is fenced for horse pasture and is reached by a long, tree-lined gravel entry drive.

The five-bay south main facade has a long vista to the south, as it stands at the edge of a high hillside. The facade is sheltered by a two-story flat-roofed porch supported by Tuscan Doric columns. The first story has a brick patio at ground level. There are entry doors in the first and fifth bays, of six panels surmounted by a four-light transom. The doors flank three 9/6 double-hung sash windows with sills of brick headers. The arrangement of doors and windows on the second story is the same. There is a balustrade of plain rectangular balusters on the second story porch.

Kildare is of white-painted brick. The roofing is weathered asphalt shingle. The crown-molded cornice is returned in the gable ends. The west elevation is an unfenestrated gable end with two louvered half-lunettes flanking the exterior corbelled brick chimney at loft level.

The north elevation of the main block is approximately four bays. The northeast bay is dominated by a large two-story brick gable roof wing set perpendicular to the main block, forming an "L". The wing is 2' x 2 bays, with 9/6 sash windows on the first story and 6/6 sash on the second story. There are high evergreen trees growing on the northwest side of the house, infilling the L and obscuring the facades.

The two-bay north gable end of the rear wing has 2/2 sash windows flanking a narrow exterior brick chimney centered on the facade. There are louvered half-lunette openings flanking the chimney at loft level. There are two narrow rectangular windows with brick header sills at foundation level.

The east side of the dwelling is complex due to the many additions. There is a narrow 3 x 2 bay two-story gable roof brick wing projecting from the east end of the main block, completing the building's "T" shaped plan. The resulting ell between this east wing and the north (rear) wing is infilled by a one-story shed roofed frame addition covered with German siding and having a north-facing porch.

The narrow east wing is slightly lower in height than the main block, and is probably the earlier portion of the house. It is laid in common bond. The three bay south (main) elevation is set back from the main block. There are 6/6 sash windows with Jack arch lintels on the first story. The second story windows have wooden lintels and sills. Two small square 3/3 sash windows are located over the second and third bays at loft level. The narrow east gable end of the wing has a returned cornice and two square 2/2 sash windows at loft level. The wall surface has been covered with stucco. The first story is covered by the frame one-story infill addition which wraps around the east gable end and has an east entry door.

The land around the house slopes down on all sides. The entry drive branches off with a lane running south of the house, through a farm yard. The six frame agricultural outbuildings clustered around the farm lane are all in good repair, painted white with red metal roofs. They all date to the twentieth century. There is also a smaller residence in this cluster.

Kildare is significant as a plantation house with a long history, in the Oxon Hill District of the County. It is a large white-painted brick building standing high atop a hill, making it a local landmark. In the mid-twentieth century it was the home of the William Miller family, who developed and promoted Rosecroft Raceway, located just south of the house.

Kildare was constructed in two sections. The original three story, three-by-two bay brick dwelling dates to the second quarter of the 19th century. A large ell-shaped west and north addition was constructed in the first decade of the twentieth century, more than doubling the size of the house. The early structure has been altered so that its original orientation is not apparent.

In 1854 Dr. Peter Heiskell purchased 320 acres of Tolson's Purchase from George S. Tolson.¹ The original block of the house was constructed by Tolson or by Heiskell shortly after he acquired the property. During the Heiskell ownership the property became known as Kildare.²

Dr. Peter Heiskell died in 1893, but the property continued in family ownership through 1945. Significant improvements were made to the property in 1898, 1912 and in 1927, indicating that the large ell-shaped block was probably added during that range of time.³

After the death of Jesse L. Heiskell in 1942, Kildare was acquired by William E. Miller, founder of the William E. Miller Furniture Company. Miller established the Rosecroft Raceway south of the house, on part of the property, and resided at Kildare.⁴ After the death of Miller's widow in 1972 the property passed to Riggs National Bank as part of a Trust agreement. It is presently tenant occupied.

The house and property is in a portion of the county experiencing rapid suburban development. There are garden apartment complexes to the north and east. The house stands as a landmark and reminder of the formerly rural, agrigarian character of the area.
