The Forest Grove Church is located inside Andrews Air Force Base near its eastern boundary. It is a wood frame, gable-roofed building approximately 29 feet wide by 44 feet long. Its main facade is its south gabled end. Centered in this south gable end is a projecting two-story crenelated tower. Entry into the church is through six-panel double wood doors, which are surmounted by a dentilled frieze, and, above the frieze, a pointed-arch transom filled with stained glass. There is a pointed-arch louvered window on each face of the tower near its top. The exterior of the building is covered in german siding, painted white. The roof is covered with asphalt shingles.

The sides of the church are three bays long. The windows are pointed-arch, double-hung sash, stained glass memorials. Similar windows flank the tower on the south gable end, and are built into the two side walls of the projecting alter at the north gable end. The building rests on a high concrete block foundation which encloses a full basement.

With the exception of the front of the church, the structure is surrounded by a graveyard, with gravestones dating from 1874 to 1938. The burials represent a large number of the families occupying the site prior to development of the airfield.

The interior walls of the church have vertical wood wainscoting below a chair rail. Some of the stained glass windows display memorials to members of the Binger, Beall, Shreve, and Kingsbury families.

Records indicate that in 1880 the church was rebuilt from the foundation up. Again, in 1914, the church was repaired when it was shifted off of its foundation by heavy winds. In 1954 the building was renovated by the Air Force, and again in 1984. In 1986 the property was completely rebuilt after it was gutted by fire. As part of Andrews Air Force Base, the church is known as Chapel II.

To the north of the church is a graveyard, with gravestones dating from 1874 to 1938.

Significance:

Forest Grove Church is a good example of simple Gothic Revival ecclesiastical architecture. In the years before the Civil War, when the issue of slavery divided the Methodist Church, some congregations of the Baltimore Conference broke away from the General Conference, and became members of the Methodist Episcopal Church South. It was at this time that members of the previously-existing Methodist churches at Long Old Fields and Beall's meeting house established Forest Grove as a chapel of the Methodist Episcopal Church South; the first chapel was built on this site in 1854 on the north side of the Washington-Marlboro Road at Centreville. In 1880, the church structure was rebuilt, but was destroyed by a severe windstorm in 1914. At this time, the present church was built, incorporating some of the stained glass windows from the earlier church. In 1942, the United States government took over a large tract of land, including the church, for the establishment of (Andrews) Air Force Base. Forest Grove Church is now known as Chapel #2; its former congregation has merged with that of the Forestville (Long Old Fields) Methodist Church, forming the Forest Memorial United Methodist Church.

Forest Grove Methodist Church, known as the Andrews Air Force Base Chapel #2, is located inside the base boundary near the eastern boundary. It is a frame, gable-roofed building, 29 feet wide and 44 feet long. The main facade is its south gable end. Centered in this south gable end is a projecting two-story crenelated tower. The belfry tower is 72 feet square. Entry into the tower is through six-paneled double doors surmounted by a dentilled frieze. Above the frieze is a pointed-arch transom filled with stained glass. There is a pointed-arch louvred window on each face of the tower near its top.

The sides of the church are three bays long. The windows are pointed-arch, double-hung sash, stained glass memorials. Similar windows flank the tower on the south gable end, and are built into the two side walls of the projecting altar at the north gable end. The building rests on a high concrete foundation which encloses a full basement. The siding is German, painted white; the roof is covered with green asphalt shingle.

The interior walls of the church have vertical wainscoting below the chair-rail. Some of the stained glass windows display memorials to members of the Binger, Beall, Shreve and Kingsbury families. The ceiling beams are now hidden from view by white asbestos tiles.

The church sits on approximately a one acre site. To the north of the church is a graveyard with gravestones dating from 1874 to 1938.

Forest Grove Methodist Church is a good example of simple Gothic Revival Architecture. The first Forest Grove Methodist Church was established in 1854 as part of the Methodist Church South. By the early 1840s, this area of Prince George's County had two centers of Methodist worship: at Long Old Fields (present day Forestville) and at Beall's meeting house (the predecessor of present day Bells Methodist Church in Camp Springs), both part of the Bladensburg Circuit of the Baltimore Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church. In the years before the Civil War, the issue of slavery divided the Methodist Church. When the General Conference declared abolition of slaves a condition of church membership, southern conferences split off from the General Conference to form the Methodist Episcopal Church South. Baltimore, a border conference, voted to adhere to the General Conference in condemning the institution of slavery, thus provoking some individual congregations of the Bladensburg Circuit to break from their conference and declare themselves part of the Methodist Episcopal Church South. It was at this time that Forest Grove was established as a chapel of the Methodist Episcopal Church South. The chapel was built in 1854 on a small lot (on the north side of Washington-Marlboro Road at Centerville) which was deeded in 1855.

During the Civil War the church was used as a headquarters for Union soldiers guarding the approaches to Washington. Although there is no proof, it is believed that Union soldiers may have been buried at the site. After the end of the Civil War, Forest Grove Church became part of a new circuit, the Marboro Circuit, until 1896 when the new Forest Grove Circuit was established. In 1880, the church structure was rebuilt, and remained standing until it was destroyed by a severe windstorm in 1914. At this time, the present church was built, incorporating some of the stained glass windows from the earlier church.

In 1942 the US Government took over a large tract of land, including the community of Centerville, for the establishment of Andrews Air Force Base. This is the last remaining structure in the old community. The cemetery has been closed to burials since the government acquired the land. Today the church is used for a variety of services, serving the military community.

This is an interesting, Gothic Revival country church, that has been preserved on the grounds of the sprawling Andrews Air Force Base. It is a frame building, with pointed-arch stained-glass windows. The entrance is in the south gable facade, via a projecting, two-story tower with a crenellated cap. The double doors are topped by a large, arched window. The building is sheathed with German siding.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Reportedly, this church was built in 1854 to serve families in the now-gone community of Centreville. It seems to have been known then as Forest Grove Methodist Church. After the Civil War period, with the split in the Methodist Church, it was a M.E. South Church. It shows on Hopkins' Atlas as such. It was apparently remodeled to its present Gothic style about 1880.

This is one of the nicer country churches seen in the county, and it is the last real remnant of the old Centreville community that was absorbed by the huge air base here in the 1940's.




