Description

The Nourse House is a multi-section frame gable-roofed house. Its main block is two-and-one-half-stories, with entrance in the third bay of its three-bay main south facade. There are two interior chimneys, one in each plane of the roof, at the west gable end. The main facade was extended in length by one bay to the east, with a two-and-one-half-story half-gable flounder addition. An additional two-and-one-half-story two-bay-by-two-bay east wing is attached to the east gable end of the main block. Across the south facade is a one-story, four-bay porch resting on brick supports. A one-story rear porch with overhanging eaves and exposed rafter ends is now fully enclosed and converted into kitchen space. The exterior of the house is covered with plain horizontal board at first and second level, and with brown lapped shingle at loft level. The cornice of the main block is boxed; the east wing has overhanging eaves with exposed rafter ends. The roof of the east wing is shingled with slate; all other roof surfaces are covered with synthetic shingle.

Significance

The Nourse House at the Vineyard consists of a mid-nineteenth century frame dwelling which has had numerous additions over the years. The nucleus of the house is typical of rural domestic architecture of Civil War period Prince George's county, with a side stairhall and double parlor plan. It was built circa 1866 by William Nourse on 100 acres of property which he purchased in that year. The Nourse family named their farm "The Vineyard" and made it their home for four generations. In the 1890's, Anna Nourse Meloy, brought her family to live at "The Vineyard". It is probably at this time that the east wing was constructed, creating an additional parlor with Victorian slate mantel. Anna Meloy's family maintained a farm there into the twentieth century; subsequent changes included the flounder addition, and the rebuilding of the kitchen into the rear "craftsman" style porch. The property passed out of the Nourse-Meloy family in 1948 when Anna Meloy's grandson sold The Vineyard to the present owners. The house is an interesting composite: a substantial farm dwelling of the 1860's, with late Victorian and early twentieth century "craftsman" style additions.

The Nourse House is a multi-section frame gable-roofed house situated at the end of a long farm lane in a rural wooded area. Its main block is two-and-one-half-stories, ca. 32 by 24 feet, with entrance in the third bay of its three-bay main south facade. There are two interior chimneys, one in each plane of the roof, at the west gable end. The main facade was extended in length by one bay to the east, with a two-and-one-half-story half-gable (flounder) addition. An additional two-and-one-half-story two-bay-by-two-bay east wing is attached to the east gable end of the main block. This east wing has an interior chimney at the ridge at its east gable end.

Across the south facade is a one-story, four-bay porch resting on brick supports. A door in the second bay of the second story leads onto the flat roof of the porch. The porch is now enclosed with screening. A one-story rear porch spans the north elevation and has a shed roof with overhanging eaves and exposed rafter ends. It is now fully enclosed and converted into kitchen space.

The exterior of the house is covered with plain horizontal ^{boards} (painted white) at first and second level, and with brown lapped shingle at loft level. The cornice of the main block is boxed, with no decoration; the east wing has overhanging eaves with exposed rafter ends. The windows are 6/6 double-hung-sash and have plain board surrounds throughout. The roof of the east wing is shingled with slate; all other roof surfaces are covered with synthetic shingle. Foundations of the main block are of brick, while that of the flounder addition and of the east wing are of concrete.

The interior plan of the main block consists of side stairhall and two side parlors; the fireplaces of these two parlors have been closed. Interior architraves of doors and windows feature heavy ovolo moldings. The staircase has handsome turned newel and balusters. There is a Victorian marbleized slate mantel in the east wing. The flounder addition now houses a bathroom.

There are several outbuildings in the farm complex. To the east is a large livestock barn with vertical board siding, ventilators at the ridge, and a shed (stable) addition to the south. North of the house is a flat-roofed concrete block shed. West of the house is a long flat-roofed concrete block stall, twelve bays long. Farther to the northwest is a small gable-roofed hay barn standing on a concrete foundation.

The nucleus of the house is typical of rural domestic architecture of Civil War period Prince George's county, with a side stairhall and double parlor plan. It was built circa 1866 by William Nourse of Washington, D.C., on 100 acres of property which he purchased in that year.¹ The Nourse family renamed their farm "The Vineyard" and made it their home for four generations.

In the 1890's, Anna Nourse Meloy, daughter of William and Isabella Nourse, brought her family to live at "The Vineyard". It is probably at this time that the east wing was constructed, creating an additional parlor with Victorian slate mantel, and bedroom space above. Anna Meloy's family maintained a farm there into the twentieth century; subsequent changes included the flounder addition which added a bathroom off the main stair-hall, and the rebuilding of the kitchen into the (enclosed) rear one-story "craftsman" style porch.²

The property passed out of the Nourse-Meloy family in 1948 when Anna Meloy's grandson sold the Vineyard to the present owners.³ For much of the recent period the farm has been rental property.

The old meathouse which used to stand north of the house no longer survives, but the old hay barn and the large livestock barn (with stable attached) are still standing and functional. The whole complex is secluded, and completely invisible from the local roads. Once accessible from the north (by a lane from Dower House Road), it is now accessible only by a long straight lane west from Woodyard Road. The house is an interesting composite: a substantial farm dwelling of the 1860's, with late Victorian and early twentieth century "craftsman" style additions.
