Building #01025 is a one and one-half story tall, wood frame residential structure constructed in the early part of the 20th century, which was acquired by the United States government in 1942 as part of the development of Camp Springs Army Airfield. Currently, the building is being used as housing for Andrews Air Force Base personnel.

As originally built, the structure contained four bedrooms and one bath. Along with the main bedroom and bath, a dining room, kitchen and minor storage space were also on the first floor. Three of the bedrooms were located in the attic space of the building. The main entrance to the house was from the front porch directly into the living room, with a secondary entrance at the rear leading into the kitchen. The rear door is now used as the primary access into the building.

The building foundation is brick. The main portion of the building is clad in wood siding. Existing windows are a combination of six-over-one and aluminum jalousie sash. A portion of the units are covered with aluminum storm windows. The large roof dormer on the front of the structure retains the wood siding and has three six-over-one windows opening into the smallest of the attic bedrooms. Additions have been made to both the rear and front of the building, adding storage and utility space, and enclosing the front porch.

Substantial modifications have been made to the building fabric through the use of the structure. The setting of the structure has been changed significantly through the loss of open space around the building and the farming activities that existed at the time of its acquisition by the government, and isolation of the building from its surrounding buildings.

This property is one of the structures pre-dating the construction of the airfield. It is located in the far southwest corner of the base. The property was used as a residential unit prior to being acquired by the government, a use that is maintained. The property has received numerous additions over the years, including enclosure of the front porch, new kitchen, and a bay window on the north side.

The integrity of the building has been significantly damaged through these additions, the use of vinyl siding, and selected window replacement. In addition, the building has been isolated through the removal of any adjacent structures and the construction of a highway at the building front.




