Quarters #01508 was originally constructed as one of the standard Bachelor Officers Quarters in 1946 at Andrews Air Force Base. It is located within the cluster of Visiting Officers' Quarters (VOQ) on the west side of the base. One of the twenty-two individual VOQ structures that were constructed at the base, #01508 has been converted to a family housing unit. Where each of the VOQ buildings were designed to house eight visiting officers, with accommodations for sleeping and assembling, along with both private and shared toilet facilities, #01508 has been modified to be a four bedroom, two bath house, with expanded living space and extensive landscaping.

#01508 is one-story tall, rectangular structure built of concrete block. Originally, the structure was basically 87 feet long by 35 feet wide, with two legs, 20' x 15' each, extending from one long side. The size of the building has been expanded to incorporate a formal dining room and sun porch. The original windows were awning, most of which have been changed to large units of fixed glass. The hip roof on the building has pronounced ventilator louvers at each end and projection. The building currently has a stucco finish on the exterior, and lacks any decorative detail. Since original construction, the quarters has been modified to accommodate current livability standards for the military.

All of the original awning windows have been replaced with either fixed glass or double-hung sash. The plan of the building has been substantially modified to convert a building designed as communal housing for eight into a single family residence.

The building fabric has been damaged through the introduction of materials inconsistent with the original design of the structure; the original setting of the building has been changed significantly through the introduction of landscaping and security fencing, separating it from its historic context; and the design integrity of the building has been altered through the introduction of additions expanding the building.

Quarters #01508, originally constructed as part of the Visiting Officer's Quarters, was converted to a General Officer's Quarters with the addition of a dining room and sun room, and substantial modification to the interior. The structure retains the same one-story, gabled roof configuration of the original, but is substantially larger and open. All of the original awning windows have been replaced with either ed glass or double-hung sash. The plan of the building has been substantially modified to convert a building designed as communal housing for eight into a single family residence.

The building fabric has been damaged through the introduction of materials inconsistent with the original design of the structure; the original setting of the building has been changed significantly through the introduction of landscaping and security fencing, separating it from its historic context; and the design integrity of the building has be altered through the introduction of additions expanding the building.



