The structures are located on the east side of the base, adjacent to the East Perimeter Road. The buildings are approximately 150' long by 30' wide, with a continuous concrete loading dock along one side. Their gable roofs are covered with asphalt shingles. The buildings have been modified since its original construction to meet mission and functional needs. These changes include the installation of new windows and loading dock doors, along with new roofs. The principal facade of the building faces an access road and other warehouses.

Buildings #3296 and #3417 are effectively identical in design and use. Both structures were constructed as storage warehouses in the third wave of development and expansion of the base in 1944. Since their construction, both of the structures have undergone numerous changes—original windows have been blocked up or replaced with new sash, roof have been replaced, and warehouse doors replaced. Neither building has any distinctive or definable character. They are basically nondescript concrete block buildings that were part of development of the base. They served no unique function, or present a defining element of the base.

The building fabric has been damaged through the introduction of materials inconsistent with the original design of the structure, such as new windows, new doors, and roofs. In addition, the original setting of the buildings has been changed significantly through the loss of open space with the addition of other military buildings immediately adjacent to the structures.


