Other changes include the addition of concrete aprons and security fencing around the building.

The integrity of Building #03457 has been damaged significantly through numerous changes that have taken place since its construction. An architecturally incompatible fiberboard addition has been placed at one end of the building along its main, front elevation. The original steel industrial windows have been replaced with double-hung wood windows through out the building. The entire building has been covered with aluminum siding, and its roofing materials have been changed. A concrete apron has been added to the building front, and the sides and rear of the building are enclosed within a chain link security fence. In addition, the integrity of design, use, and setting of the structure has been significantly damaged.




