These buildings are all one-story tall, concrete block structures built in 1943 on the east side of the base. The buildings were all constructed as support facilities for base personnel, such as mess halls, post offices, and clinics. They are rectangular in plan, with entry at their ends. Each building has a moderate-sloped, asphalt shingle, gabled roof. Between 1958 and 1961, the buildings were covered with aluminum siding. They have all been converted to office space. Interior spaces have been modified significantly to accommodate new uses. The original windows, doors, and roof have all been replaced.

Constructed in 1943 as more permanent "temporary" structures, the Building #03471 series were developed as support structures for the personnel at the new airfield. Each was basically an open floor plan, concrete block building with no architectural detail of unique features. Individually or as a group, they do not represent a significant element in the context of development of the base or WWII mobilization. They are not consistent with the standardized design or construction in the mobilization period, nor are they unique expressions of style, use, or construction. Since their construction all of the buildings have been converted to other uses, primarily administrative offices. The interiors of the buildings have been modified to accommodate new uses. The original windows, doors, and roofs have been replaced, and the exteriors have been covered with aluminum siding. Some of the buildings have received lean-to additions to their ends.


