Located at the southeast intersection of Fehet and Patrick Avenues of Andrews Air Force Base (AFB), this modest one-story tall frame dwelling dates from approximately 1920. A typical small house of the period, the building provided two bedrooms, bath, living space and a kitchen. Resting on a concrete foundation, the building is detailed by a gabled roof, two cross gabled bays, exterior brick chimney and 6/1 windows. Interior modifications have accommodated additional rooms for continued use as military housing. This property was a component of the land purchased by the Army in 1942 to create the Camp Springs Airfield, the forerunner of Andrews AFB. Based on a reconnaissance survey, the Air Force determined that the building did not possess architectural significance, nor was its association with Air Force Base significant to be eligible as an individual resource. No historic district exists in this area of the base. The Trust concurred that the building was not eligible for the ational Register.



Capsule Summary

This building is one-story tall, concrete block structure built in 1945 on the east side of the base. The building was originally constructed as a vehicle service shop, with five service bays. The structure has a flat roof. It has been converted to a retail store. Interior spaces have been modified significantly to accommodate the new use. The service bays have been blocked up, the original windows, doors, and roof have been replaced. A new fascia has been placed at the top of the building. There are no landscape plantings around the building.

Building #03487 has been modified significantly since its construction in 1945 as a vehicle service facility. Evidence can be seen of the original service bay door openings, restroom doors, and windows, all now blocked up. A new parapet has been installed along the roof line, the original flat roof has been replaced, new storefront windows and doors installed, and the interior of the building has been changed to accommodate its use as a retail store.

The building was constructed in a third wave of construction at the base. It had no relationship or association with the original development and construction of the base, the historic context of WWII, or the mobilization effort in that period. The building was constructed to support the personnel stationed at the base.

Quarters #3492 is a one story tall, wood frame residential structure, with a concrete block foundation, constructed in the early 20th century. Prior to acquisition of the property by the United States government as part of the development of the Camp Springs Army Air Field in 1942, the structure was a private residence set in a semi-rural environment just west of Meadows, MD. As original designed, the 1,637 gross square foot residence had two bedrooms and one bath, a living room, dining room, and kitchen. The bath and main bedroom were located on the main floor of the building, with the second bedroom in the attic. Entrance to the structure is on the north side of the building, leading directly into the living room. A secondary entrance to the kitchen is located on the west side of the building.

The primary modifications to the building include the subdivision of the living room to accommodate an additional bedroom on the first floor, and remodeling of the bathroom and kitchen. The house is currently covered with painted wood siding. The windows appear to be original six-over-six, double-hung wood sash, now covered with aluminum storm windows. The roof surface on the front of the building has two, sharply angled dormers, one at the entrance, and one at the dining room. The building continues to be used as a residence for Andrews Air Force Base personnel.

The setting of the structure has been changed significantly through the loss of open space around the building and the farming activities that existed at the time of its acquisition by the government. Also, the physical context of the building has been changed through the introduction of military buildings and activities immediately adjacent to the structure, and the isolation of the house through the construction of roadways entirely around the building.

Prepare both a summary paragraph of significance and a general statement of history and support.

Although the form and style of Building #03492 remains essentially intact, the historic context in which it was originally constructed has been lost. This property was built prior to acquisition of the property by the government for development of the airfield. According it had no association with the original airbase. After construction of the base the property has been used for personnel housing, along with a number of other pre-base houses. This use was based on the availability of the property rather than on any unique historic or architectural qualities of the house itself. During this period it has not represented any unique quality or character of the base.

In the historic context of the site prior to base development the house did not represent a significant historic or architectural element. It was one of many unrelated early 20th century residential structures built in the Meadows, MD area. The original setting of the building has been changed significantly through the loss of open space and the introduction of military structures and activities immediately adjacent to the structure.
