DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This was certainly one of the earliest homes in the entire area. It was a small, one-story structure, with brick walls on the sides and rear. These walls were covered with stucco. The front wall of the house was built of logs, and covered with clapboards. It had a very steeply-pitched A-roof, that sloped to the rear in salt-box fashion. There were brick, double-end chimneys on the outside walls, with brick pents between them. A later, two-story frame addition was offset to the rear. The house was literally blown to bits by a gas explosion on April 4, 1969.

This house was reportedly built ca. 1723 by John Magruder (born-1694, died-1750) and it housed many generations of this family that played an eminent role in the area's history. It was undoubtedly one of the oldest homes still standing in Montgomery or Prince George's Counties.


