### **Capsule Summary**

The 25-acre Ryon Farm property is the consolidation of seven separate parcels and now contains four standing residential structures and associated outbuildings that are over 50 years of age. All residences and three outbuildings appear to date to the mid-20<sup>th</sup>-century and are related to the same family. Due to the consolidation of the properties these four structures are considered here together. Other buildings on the site include a modern house on Ryon Road that appears to date to the late-20<sup>th</sup>-century .

The four dwellings and their associated outbuildings within the Cabin Branch Study Area are not associated with significant events (Criterion A) or persons (Criterion B); do not embody distinctive characteristics of type, period, or method of construction (Criterion C); and are unlikely to provide information important in history (Criterion D). They are in a dilapidated state and retain little integrity of design, workmanship, or materials. Therefore, they are not eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places.

The 25-acre Ryon Farm Survey District is the consolidation of seven separate parcels and now contains four standing residential structures and three outbuildings that are over 50 years of age. An additional two outbuildings appear to be of recent construction. All dwellings appear to date to the mid-20<sup>th</sup>-century and are related to the same family. Due to the consolidation of the properties these four structures are considered here together. Other buildings on site include a modern house on Ryon Road that appears to date to the late-20<sup>th</sup>-century .

4379 Ryon Road:

4379 Ryon Road (Liber 3238 Folio 92) is a mid-20<sup>th</sup>-century, one-story, side-gabled frame residence with asbestos siding and an asphalt-singled roof set on a concrete block foundation. It is three bays wide and two bays deep with measurements of 32 feet wide and 28 feet deep. The structure was boarded at both the doors and windows so neither these features nor the interior could be observed, however, first-story windows appear to have been wood, double-hung sashes. A few vinyl shutters remain on some window openings. The exterior of the foundation has steel sash, two-light casement windows which lead to a basement. The home features a poured concrete front entry on its southeast corner with small, overhung roof and a concrete block, south gable-side entry with a pressure-treated deck that wraps around from the side entry to the rear of the house. The side entry is protected by a small, side gabled roof. The north façade features a chimney which likely vents the heating system. This building is in a deteriorated condition with cracking foundation and crumbling concrete stoops and stairs. A small plywood clad shed with asphalt shingle roof lies northwest of the house. It appears to date from the late-20<sup>th</sup>-century.

9000 Armstrong Lane:

9000 Armstrong Lane (Liber 31521 Folio 207) is a mid-20<sup>th</sup>-century, one-and-one-half story, side-gabled frame dwelling with breezeway and one-and-one-half story attached garage addition. The main house measures 28 feet wide by 32 feet deep. Three bays wide and two bays deep, the house sits on a concrete block foundation. The basement level has awning windows. The front steps are concrete leading to a deteriorated wood four panel door with fan light. The main house features aluminum siding over what appears to be asbestos siding as visible in rear additions. An exterior brick chimney is present on the east gable end that pierces the roof of the breezeway addition.

The gable sides are clad with aluminum resembling board and batten and the asphalt-shingled roof features a wide front dormer with triple window opening. The windows have all been removed but a single set has been left in the house demonstrating that windows were six-over-six, double hung wood sashes. The house is primarily entered through the side split-entry with step up to the rear kitchen which features metal cabinets and steps down to an unfinished basement. Original interior walls are plaster with deep baseboard although the front room appears to have a newer dividing wall over the basement stairway. A small addition on the northeast corner at the rear measures 15 feet wide and extends eight feet from the rear wall. Originally clad with asbestos siding, it was later clad with aluminum although most of the aluminum has been removed.

The breezeway is a simple one-story, side-gabled structure with concrete block foundation and continuous line of three windows and an entrance door on both south and north sides. Walls are clad with asbestos siding and the front-gabled roof is clad with asphalt shingles. Windows and doors have been removed. The garage is two bays deep with a very wide overhead door on its front, or south entrance. The garage is clad with aluminum siding. The two side windows are three-pane fixed wooden sashes and rear windows are two, six-pane fixed sashes of which one remains. The garage has wooden steps leading to its upper half story. The half story of the garage retains a single six-over-six, double hung wood window. The garage may have been originally constructed as a detached structure and connected by the breezeway at a later date. The entire structure is in poor condition with nearly all windows and doors removed, siding in disrepair, and interior in ruins. A small plywood clad shed of late-20<sup>th</sup>-century origin, having asphalt shingled roof, lies northwest of the house. It is nearly obliterated by vegetation.

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8908 Armstrong Lane:

8908 Armstrong Lane (Liber 28340 Folio 592) is a mid-20<sup>th</sup>-century, one-story, side-gabled, three-by-one bay frame residence with numerous additions. The original structure measures 25 feet wide and 20 feet deep. It sits on a concrete foundation and has asbestos siding and asphalt shingled roof. At the southeast corner of the front is a deep front porch with two turned wooden columns supported by a concrete floor. The porch has a shed roof with asphalt shingles. Three additions have been constructed to the rear (north) of the original house. The first appears to be an early side-gabled ell addition which is one-bay deep. The roof is clad with asphalt shingles. The remaining two additions are also side-gabled additions tacked on to the rear of the ell. The exteriors of these additions are clad with plywood on shallow, poured concrete slabs with remnants of both asbestos and aluminum siding and boarded up windows. The interior of the original structure, visible through a single broken six-over-six, double-hung wood window at the rear, appears to be of similar construction to 9000 Armstrong Lane with plaster walls and deep baseboards. This structure is in very poor condition.

8904 Armstrong Lane:

8904 Armstrong Lane (Liber 31521 Folio 207) is a mid-20<sup>th</sup>-century, one-and-one-half story, cross-gabled, frame residence with asbestos siding and poured concrete foundation. It measures 26 feet wide and 27 feet deep with a 16-foot wide addition on its east side. A central front entry features poured concrete steps and concrete stoop. The rear has a one-bay cross gabled section that appears to be original to the structure. All the windows and door are boarded and the interior could not be examined. Windows are flanked by wooden shutters. Basement windows are three-pane wood awnings. The roof is clad with asphalt shingles and an exterior brick chimney rises from the east gable end, piercing a shed roofed addition.

A shed-roofed addition is attached to the east side. It is frame, set on brick piers and has a combination of aluminum and asphalt siding. The aluminum siding pattern suggests that this was once an open porch that was later enclosed. The north side of the addition has concrete steps leading to the basement. A rear entrance with concrete stoop is located within the northeast inside corner formed by the main house and the rear ell. The house is in poor condition.


To the north of this residence, on the narrow but deep lot, stand three standing outbuildings. The first is a small, side-gabled shed with two windows flanking a central wood door. The shed is clad with un-painted clapboard and is in very poor condition. The second is a long, shallow, frame workshop with shed roof clad with asphalt roll roofing, having two sets of large wood doors. This building is also in very poor condition. The third outbuilding is a small, side-gabled, frame barn with vertical board siding that is nearly in ruins. All outbuildings are set on poured concrete foundations.

The four dwellings and their associated outbuildings within Ryon Farm are not associated with significant events (Criterion A) or persons (Criterion B); do not embody distinctive characteristics of type, period, or method of construction (Criterion C); and are unlikely to provide information important in history (Criterion D). They are in a dilapidated state and retain little integrity of design, workmanship, or materials. Therefore, they are not eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places.

Ryon Farm has been traced to a transfer between the heirs of Allen P. Bowie and Catherine Ryon in 1886. Catherine and her husband, Robert, lived at a now-demolished home at the intersection of Armstrong Lane and Ryon Road. Between 1900 and 1910 Robert Ryon died and the eldest son, Milton Ryon, received 19 acres of the property and lived with his mother and his wife, Julia, in the family home. In 1920 Milton purchased 10 additional acres from his siblings following the settlement of an equity case. Milton Ryon died in 1931 and his second wife, Juanita, (Julia died) remained in the family home while Milton's son, Robert, acquired the property at 8904 Armstrong Lane, having life tenancy with the property transferring to his children upon his death. This seems to indicate that Robert was living on the property at the time of his father's death. This property passed to Robert's son's widow, T. Eileen Ryon, upon Robert's death in 1968. 8908 Armstrong Lane passed to Robert's daughter, Doris and her husband, Jefferson Davis Chestnut. In 1971 the front portion of this property was sub-divided from the rear portion and the home went to Doris's daughter and her husband, Carol and Raymond Decatur. 9000 Armstrong Lane was divided from the original parcel in the 1940s and given to the Chestnuts by Juanita Ryon. 4379 Ryon Road, and the adjacent parcel passed to Eileen Ryon in 1953 with the adjacent parcel being divided off in 1965.

The Ryon family owned the property from 1886 until the late-20<sup>th</sup>-century, subdividing it as the family grew and changed. From a single residence (now demolished), a total of six residences existed within the Ryon Farm property at one time. Currently five dwellings remain standing but one has not been evaluated here as it was not constructed until after 1965.




