Description of Property and Eligibility Determination *(Use continuation sheet if necessary and attach map and photo)*

Constructed in 1941, this structure was built in response to intensified suburbanization of the study area following the construction of MD 210 and related to the expansion of federal offices and military installations in the county. This side gabled, one and a half story house has a projecting gable made of brick with a decorative brick parapet enclosing the front porch stoop. The slightly curved roofline is accentuated by the insertion of a cast medallion within the brick near the gable. Dormers flank the intersecting gable, and an exterior brick chimney exists at the south end of the structure. A substantial shed addition in the rear, vinyl siding, and modern windows alter the historic appearance of the building, which may be associated with the Victory Deliverance Temple next door.

Research has not revealed any association between this structure and events that have made a significant contribution to the broad patterns of our history (Criterion A) or the lives of persons significant in the past (Criterion B). The building is not a good example of any style; nor is it distinguished; it does not represent the work of a master or display high artistic merit (Criterion C). Although archeology was not addressed in this study, there is no indication
